Mrs. Vincent was first hired by the Wayne YMCA in 1958. She was program director for the teenage program in Dearborn, Dearborn Heights and Inkster. She also worked to develop the YW program in Livonia.

With the birth of a son, Todd, in 1962, Mrs. Vincent retired from a staff position to become a volunteer. In 1964, she was elected to the board of directors. Later she returned to the YW staff on a part-time basis, and concerned herself with special projects. She was responsible for establishing the cultural-tutorial program in cooperation with the Inkster school system.

Kelloggs Wed 50 Years

The family Bible that has been used to record important events for a longtime Farmington clan soon will have a new date added to its log.

It will be Sunday, Nov. 1, 1970, when Mr. and Mrs. Cecil Kellogg of Gill Road mark 50 years of married life.

They will celebrate with an open house for friends and relatives from 2 to 6 p.m. Giving a hand for the festivities will be their married children, Wanda Daugherbaugh of West Branch, Arlene Ripaldi of Farmington and Cecil C. Kellogg Jr. of Farmington.

There are also eight grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

THE BIBLE, kept in a handy spot in the Kellogg home, was presented to Mr. Kellogg's father when he was married in 1921.

"It's supposed to keep the records of the Kellogg family," said Mrs. Ruth Kellogg. "It will go next to our son, and then his son Michael."

Cecil and Ruth Kellogg were married Nov. 3, 1920, in the home of Ruth's sister near Fowlerville. They made their first home in Farmington and have lived in the community ever since, except for one depression days venture to Flint.

"I went there to look for work one fall, but we came back in the spring," Kellogg said.

HIS FIRST JOB in Farmington was with the Detroit United Railway. "In those days the town was strictly a DUR stop," he recalled.

He worked as a mechanic in the DUR "pit" — the garage located across Grand River from the present site of the LaSalle Winery.

After inter-urban runs ceased in 1927, Kellogg went to work for the Farmington Lumber Co.

"I started out driving horses to deliver coal and lumber," he remembered. Later he became yard foreman, a position he held until his retirement in 1960.

THE KELLOGGS have lived in several Farmington homes, building their present one 15 years ago. They have no plans to live elsewhere. "I want to stay here as long as we can," Mrs. Kellogg said. "I enjoy my garden and roses."

They will leave briefly later in the year to take a trip to Nassau.

The Moose Lodge of Garden City is donating use of the hall to the DAV. Food and refreshments will be served. Live music will be provided by a four-piece band.

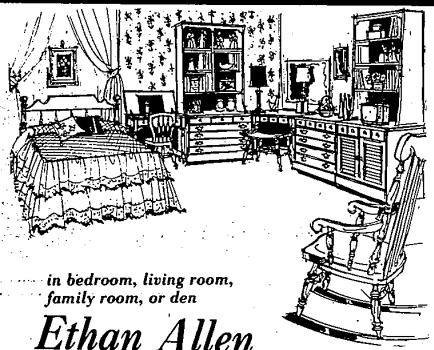

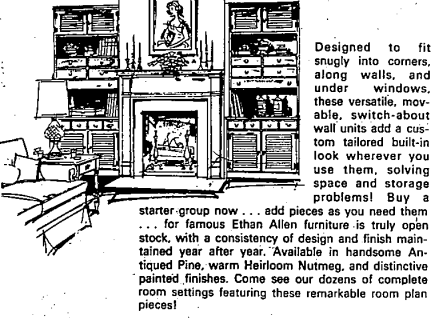
