Even indoors (the concert was originally scheduled to be played in the Orchard Ridge Amphitheater), it added up to a delightful afternoon.

ALL MEMBERS of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, the Village Chamber Players are artists-in-residence at the University of Michigan Dearborn Campus.

A husband and wife who enjoy working together in the Detroit Symphony, Brian and Marcy Schweikert, were highlighted in the first offering, Mozart's Quintet for Clarinet and Strings

In a major, K. Sli. Schweikert performed the clarinet part with clarity and precision. Mrs. Schweikert, the cellist, played with a competence and maturity that belies her years. Schweikert was again featured in the group's second offering, Beethoven's Septet in Eb major, Opus 20. Edward Saue, on the French horn, was also outstanding in this second selection.

Frank Press, music director of the group, did an admirable job both as leader of the group and as undoubtedly skilled violinist. He has an expressive face, which adds interest to a chamber music performance.
