Local Subdivisions Must Include Parks

FARMINGTON At least 25 per cent of a planned residential development (PRD) in Farmington Township must be devoted to park or open space for its residents.

This requirement came in a zoning amendment which the Farmington Township Planning Commission recently passed in an 8-0 vote.

INCLUDED in the amendment is a clause which allows the commission to modify this requirement for open space "where the character of the development makes such requirements burdensome or impractical."

PRD involves developing an area with various types of housing, such as single family detached homes and multiple dwellings, including townhouses and condominiums.

Other talk centered on the desirability of discussing the Sears-Roebuck shopping center proposal with the county planning commission, which will visit the township soon.

Although no official action was taken, several commissioners were interested in finding out how the county feels about the shopping center and its "regional significance."

IN OTHER action, the planning commission debated about petitioner Edward J.

McDonnell's request to rezone 7.7 acres between Orchard Lake and 9 Mile Rds. from single family homes to multiple dwellings, which involves apartments.

The commission voted 8-0 to approve McDonnell's petition for rezoning to multiple dwelling but only in the southern parcel. The commission mentioned that the northern half be left for "potential park area development."

In another petition, the commission unanimously approved Dr. Harvey Stein's request to rezone from single family dwelling to office
