APRIL 27, 1987
Mayor Marks opened regular public hearing of the Farmington Hills City Council on April 27, 1987 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Dolan, Dudley, Marks, Sever, Soronen and Wolf. Absent: Alkateeb. Others present: City Manager Costik, City Clerk Reynolds, Assistant City Manager Call and City Attorney Biseau.
Mayor proclaimed the Month of May as Poppy Month and May 14, 15 and 16 as Poppy Days.
Minutes of April 13, 1987 were approved as submitted.
Council ordered demolition of building down to the sub-flooring located at 23131 Alton.
Ordinance No. C-18-87 was Enacted, to rezone property on the north side of the west end of Farmington Road from R-3 to O-2.
Ordinance No. C-19-87 was Enacted, Zoning Text Amendment regarding Sign Standards, Section 60.2307 of Zoning Ordinance.
Council approved proposed Zoning Text Amendment for Group and Family Day Care Homes in residential districts, as amended, and set hearing date for May 18, 1987.
Council accepted petitions opposed to paving of Goldsmith and set it as an agenda item on May 11, 1987.
Bids were awarded to Merrill Lynch Capital markets for \$7,000,000 for major road improvement bond issue.
Temporary Permit was granted to Salvation Army for 100th Celebration from June 1 - June 5, 1987.
Parade Permit was approved for Founders Festival for July 18, 1987.
Consensus of Council to the creation of Special Assessment District for street and utility improvements for split parcels at Farmington Hills Country Club at future date.
Notification of Annual Meeting of Michigan Municipal League was accepted.
Stuart L. Sells was appointed to Parks and Recreation Commission.
Council determined to hold executive session following meeting to discuss pending litigation.
Construction contract for Pioneer Park was awarded to Gerlach Landscaping & Grading, Inc., in the amount of \$479,000, contingent upon approval by Department of Natural Resources.
Council approved establishment of water and sewer payback for utilities installed on Hollerest.
Proposed budget review schedule was set for Wednesday, May 13 and May 20, and Public Hearing was set for Wednesday, May 27, 1987.
Resolution was adopted supporting the Oakland County Road Commission Road Improvement Funding Program.
Resolution for 14 Mile Road Rehabilitation and Widening Project was adopted, as amended.

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Hartsock at 8:03 p.m. on April 20, 1987, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.
PRESENT: Hartsock, Richardson, Tupper.
ABSENT: Yoder, Campbell.
OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Deputy Director Goss, City Attorney Kelly, Acting Clerk Murphy.
Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as corrected.
Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.
Council accepted, with regret, the resignation of Richard L. Donner, Jr., from the Downtown Development Authority Board.
Council approved the request for a Founder's Festival parade permit for July 18, 1987.
Council tabled the request for outside seating at the Potpourri Cafe, 34637 Grand River.
Council proclaimed May 14, 15 and 16, 1987 as POPPY DAYS.
Council issued a proclamation celebrating the 30th Anniversary of Green's Restaurant on May 21, 1987.
Council received the Six-Year Capital Improvement Program submitted by the Planning Commission.
Council supported Senate Bills increasing fees and highway taxes for improved roads.
Council authorized payment of \$95,320 due July 1, 1987 for the second assessment on the Caddell Drain.
Council approved a total of \$40,145 for the proposed renovation of City Hall.
Council set special study sessions from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. on May 5, May 7 and May 13 to review the recommended budget for FY 1987-1988.
Public comments were heard.
Council received the Building Department's quarterly report and the Code Enforcement Log for January through March 1987.
Council authorized the issuance of \$750,000 in Transportation Bonds and a resolution approving the notice of sale.
Council adopted a resolution authorizing the sale of \$410,000 of General Obligation Bonds to finance the city's portion of the Chatham Hills Road Improvement Project.
Monthly bills were approved for payment.
