

# Goose Lk. Owner Mute

Richard Songer, of Southfield, stood mute in Jackson County Circuit Court Tuesday to four indictments, counts issued in connection with the "rock" music festival at Songer's Goose Lake Park last August.

Songer was arrested Oct. 16 and charged with being an accessory to sale of marijuana and heroin and being in control of drugs (marijuana and heroin) without a license. The charges were brought against Songer by a Jackson County grand jury.

Judge John C. Dalton entered an innocent plea for Songer and continued his \$5,000 personal recognizance bond. Jackson County Chief Asst. Prosecutor Paul Adams said the Songer case had been placed on the docket of Judge Charles J. Falahie and will probably go to court within the next 30-60 days.

At that time, Songer can request a jury trial, or waive his rights and be tried without a jury.

Songer's attorney, Bernard

J. Fieger, of Detroit, said he "presumed" Songer would request a jury trial. However, he said, there are some "preliminary issues" he is going to handle first.

# Oakland School Enrollment Dips

Enrollment at three of four Oakland County school districts in Observeland has dropped in the past year.

Figures released by Oakland Schools Supt. William J. Emerson show that enrollment has declined in the Southfield, Clarenceville and Birmingham school districts.

Farmington was the only Oakland County school district in Observeland to show a pupil increase for the 1970-71 school year, but its gain was slight.

Losing students were Southfield, 92 in a decline from 16,367 last year; Clarenceville, 83.7 in a dip from 3,521.7 from 1969; and Birmingham, 616 in a drop from 17,528 last year.

**THE FARMINGTON** School District, on the other hand, gained 46.13 students over 1969's enrollment of 15,365.97.

Over all, Oakland County schools showed an enrollment of 238,407 on Oct. 2, a loss of 127 students compared to last year's figure.

Birmingham's present enrollment was the lowest for that school district since 1965.

Despite its loss of students this year, Southfield has doubled its 1960 student population in the last decade.

Farmington showing followed a decade of gaining 300 to 500 students a year.

This year marked the first time since the end of World War II that public school enrollment in Oakland County declined, Emerson said.

**THE STRIKE** against General Motors may have some bearing on the over-all decline in enrollment, said Terry Thomas, director of pupil personnel for Oakland Schools.

"Many families go out of the county to stay with relatives elsewhere during strikes," Thomas said.

The economic downturn is another factor. Historically families move to Oakland County with children in the

upper grades of elementary school and in high school.

Tight mortgage money has prevented new house starts on the scale of the past decade. The effect of the birth control pills has been noted for the past three years.

There has been a continuing reduction in the number of children entering kindergarten since 1967. These smaller groups of children now range through the primary grades.
