Police Career Incentives Will Aid Community -- Levy

Burton Levy, Democratic candidate for Farmington Township trustee, has offered his program for improvement of the township police department.

Levy made his statement on police to a group of citizens meeting in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Cliff Rogers.

"Elected officials and citizens must be prepared to back up their police departments with more than slogans if we are to have a department that serves the public, stops crime, and has the confidence of the people," Levy said.

"During the past months, both old and new residents have continually asked the question: 'What's wrong with our police department?'"

"There have been incidents where people have been killed, where charges have been filed by the county prosecutor and where police officers have been punished for what appears to be ridiculous reasons like having a mistake too long."

"We cannot put the blame on the 37 members of the police department and simply say these officers are not good."

"THE BLAME, asserts Levy, must be placed on leadership, particularly the township supervisor who functions as the police commissioner and on the top ranking officers in the department if they are not exercising leadership."

Studies show, he continues, that police officers want to do a fair day's work for fair pay

and want citizens to respect them and their profession.

But, he continued, police also are subject to good or bad leadership and programs in police departments.

"Therefore, I am calling for a major overhaul of the programs of the Farmington Township Department. I think that it is in the best interests of each police officer and certainly of the citizens."

Major ingredients of the overhaul, Levy explained, are: better recruiting methods; increase in quantity and quality of departmental training; a non-political promotion system; leadership which is fair and firm; and command policies that are clearly spelled out.

Levy says the present recruiting practices are open to serious question and to charges of favoritism.

A STANDARD physical and mental test should be given all applicants, he continued, and a minimum score established.

Recruitment should be continual and should be done on college campuses as well as the general community, he said. Lists of applicants should be ranked by test scores with appointments made from that list, he added.

The township this year spent only \$2,500 for police training, notes Levy, out of a total budget of over \$700,000. "This is entirely too little."

Police work is becoming more complex because of new

tools, techniques and equipment being produced, he said.

"A solid training program will not only help the community but will give the policemen a better career incentive."

"Good morale often depends on to what extent a department is willing to invest time and money training its personnel."

THE PROMOTION system should be taken out of politics, states Levy, with an objective testing and evaluation system substituted.

Complete investigations should be made of incidents that involve the use of physical force or weapons, he added.

Procedures should be established for discipline when it is warranted, he continued, and the rule book should be enforced.
