CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Hartssock at 8:00 p.m. on May 18, 1987, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

PRESENT: Campbell, Hartssock, Richardson, Tupper.

ABSENT: Yoder.

OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Lauboff, City Attorney Kelly, City Planner Wzaczny, City Clerk Bushey. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

BUDGET AND MILLAGE RATE. The City Planner presented an overview of the first two phases of the Downtown Development Authority Plan. Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

RESIGNATION. Council accepted John Gillin's letter of resignation from the Farmington Economic Development Corporation. Council authorized the closing of Raphael and Shawnee Streets to accommodate those who will participate in the July 14, 1987, Kids Day celebration.

WALK-A-THON. Council authorized the use of the city sidewalks for the 1987 Walk-a-Thon on May 30, 1987.

FENCE VARIANCE. Council granted a fence variance to Michael Drapal, 23008 Lilac, to permit him to install supporting fence posts on the inside of his proposed fence and, denied his request to install a 6 ft. screening fence in front of the rear building line.

ORDINANCES. Council opposed Senate Bill 179, which would prevent local enactment of ordinances designed to protect the public.

RESOLUTIONS. Council received and filed resolutions from the Cities of Birmingham and Hazel Park urging State support of the District Court system.

BEDDING PLANTS. Council granted approval to Borman's, Inc., for the outside sale of bedding plants at the Farmer Jack Store at the Crossroads Shopping Center.

TRAFFIC CONTROL. Council instructed the City Manager to prepare for the next regular meeting a proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance relative to Board of Zoning Appeals membership.

EXPENDITURE. Council approved the expenditure of \$150 to the Academy for State and Local Government for the operation of state and local center.

TRAFFIC CONTROL. Council introduced Traffic Control Ordinance No. C-547-87, which prohibits right turns from westbound Grand River to northbound Orchard Lake Road when the Grand River signal is in the red phase.

BID. Council awarded to the low bidder, T & M Contracting, Inc., of Auburn Hills, Michigan, the bid for the 1987 Water Improvement Project in the amount of \$225,856.80.

BID. Council accepted the low bid of Rauch Brothers Paving Company of Wixom, Michigan, in the amount of \$19,554.00 for the Drake Park Tennis Court Resurfacing.

ALTERNATE. Council reappointed William Burke to a three-year term as Alternate on the Board of Zoning Appeals.

REPORTS. Council received and filed the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Public Services Quarterly Reports for January - March, 1987.

RESOLUTION. Council adopted a resolution certifying delinquent payments as of May 8, 1987, in the amount of \$20,790.21.

BILLS. Monthly bills were approved for payment.

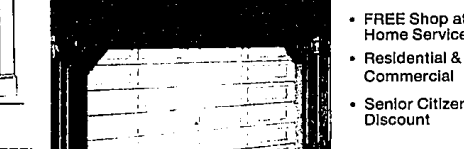
