Each week, the Recreation Division of the Farmington Hills Department of Special Services presents a synopsis of upcoming activities. For more information about programs, call the Recreation Office, 474-6115. For information about city council agenda items, call the city news line, 476-3838.

NATURE STUDY TOUR — Do you know what lives beneath the water at Heritage Park? On Saturday, June 20, from 10 a.m. to noon, aquatic adventure will be the topic. You will study plant and animal life from the park's river. Be prepared to get wet. Fee is \$3 per person or \$7 per family. Pre-registration is required.

TIGER BASEBALL — Travel to Tiger Stadium on Friday, June 12, to see the Tigers take on the Boston Red Sox. Only pre-registration through the Recreation Office by May 22 will be accepted. Children under 12 must be accompanied by a parent. Bus leaves City Hall approximately at 5:30 p.m. The fee is \$16 which includes a reserved seat and transportation.

GOLF LESSONS — Improve your golf game by learning the proper

stance, method of gripping the club and swing. Group lessons have a maximum of 10 participants and are for beginners and intermediates. Session 1 runs from May 19 to June 11 with lessons available for children, teens, adults and senior adults. When lessons are scheduled at a driving range, each participant will be asked to buy a bucket of golf balls. Fee is \$24 or \$14 for senior adults.

SUMMER DAY CAMPS — Day camps will be offered this summer for children ages 3-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Each camp will provide the children fun and enjoyment through nature study, hiking, craft projects, archery, games and special activities. All camps will be held at Heritage Park and begin the week of June 22. For camp dates, time and fee, contact the Recreation Office.

SWIMMING — Swimming instructions for beginner to advanced skill levels will be offered at Farmington and North Farmington High Schools beginning June 22. Classes run for two weeks Monday through Thursday. Children must be at least 38 inches at their chin height in order to participate. A pre-registration fee of \$23 is required. Additional

two-week sessions will begin July 6 and July 20.

NATURE WALKING — From dawn to dusk, you can walk the 3.3 miles of trails at Heritage Park, located on Farmington Road one-quarter of a mile north of 10 Mile Road.

The walking trails will take you through an array of land topography and plant life. The trails, Ravine Run, Orchard, Estate View, Cattail, Windbreak and Meadow, are marked with signs. The two entrances to the walking trails off the parking lot have maps available and a picture

display of the trails that allows you to determine your route and distance you wish to walk.

TENNIS LESSONS — For beginners and advanced beginners to work on developing your service,

ground strokes and etiquette. Session two runs on Monday and Wednesday at Farmington High and Tuesday and Thursday at North Farmington High from June 15 to July 9. Class participants provide their own tennis racquet, shoes and a new can of tennis balls. Fee is \$24.
