IN HIS RESIGNATION statement, Sitts also pondered another thought:

another thought:
"Because we work with the eight to 15 year group of children it might be possible to accomplish more that would be of benefit to these childred in later years than we have done so lar.

"If have reference to propaganda about such things as good habits, healthy bodies, avoidance of smoking and other bad habits. Most of our programs have concentrated on arts, crafts, games and exercise.

"The introduction of more meaningful ideas requires very skillful handling and it might be best not to attempt it. This idea has been proposed for food for thought."

DISCUSSING this subject, Sitts says, "We (the FARC) do nothing when a staff supervisor and oabout this. Maybe it's not feasible but certainly these children are exposed to all kinds of things outside our sphere of influence."

He retired from the telephone company in 1955 after 43 years on the job with the company. He had been a staff supervisor and expert in transmission, radio about this. Maybe it's not expertise circuitry.

Sitts has used this expertise of influence.

"They seem to be tractable. Maybe FARC people could sell them on good habits without their being aware of it.

"When the FARC has these children all so much of an age we might have an excellent opportunity to get their thinking along the right lines.

"It's something like sex education, however, it's a fine thing fut it depends on who does it and how it's done. You've got to start out with something a child thoroughly understands and then build on it."
