The Oakland County Health Dept. will clamp down on water pollution in the Far-mington Area and other communities in the county. This was the same tour that Ruth Crawford had taken the previous week. Oakland County commissioners voted Thursday to toughen the county sanitary code so that the Health Dept. can require abatement of water pollution.

Commissioners said the action is "not a cure-all, but a step in the right direction."

Under the new provision,
whenever the County Health
Board believes there is improperly treated sewage
flowing from a public or private drain, the board will
hold a public hearing todetermine if the sewage is polluting.

termine It the sewage is pol-luting.

Notices will be served on the clerk of each community believed to be the origin of the sewage and on each jowner of land in the area. If pollution is determined, the literal board may require owners of premises believed to be causing problems to

Notices will be posted in five conspicuous places in five conspicuous places in the area determined to be the origin of the improperly treated sewage and will be sent by certified mail to each person in the area.

After 30 days. the Health Board may order the drain outlet plugged until the source of the sewage is located.


