Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police, fire and court cases filed during the past week.

• FINGERS SEVERED

A 19-year-old Westland man had four fingers on his right hand severed while working on a roller-type press at Packing Material, 25330 Intech Court, at 1:30 p.m. Sept. 26.

Jeff Lilly was taken to Botsford General Hospital, Farmington Hills, then transferred to Harper Hospital, Detroit. He was reported in good condition Tuesday, a hospital spokesman said.

According to a Farmington Hills police report:

Lilly was working with a die for packing material when his hand became engaged in press rollers. Three of the four severed fingers were found, placed in sterile bandages and shipped in ice to Botsford.

• MAN ASSAULTED

A 38-year-old Farmington Hills man suffered bruises and cuts about the head and body when he was assaulted and robbed of his wallet, car keys and car early Sept. 26.

According to a Farmington Hills police report:

The man was dropped off near his house at midnight. As he walked to his house, he was assaulted and robbed. He lay unconscious on the lawn for a few hours. Sometime after awakening, he called police.

• MOBILE HOME FIRE

Damage was estimated at \$1,500 when a fire broke out in the kitchen area of a residence at the Oakland Mobile Home Park, 27520 Orchard Lake, Sept. 27.

Damage was confined to the kitchen area. A resident was awakened by a

blaring smoke detector at 6:15 a.m. He found smoke and flames traveling up a wall from a heat vent. The fire's cause continues to be investigated, said Deputy Chief Peter Baldwin of the Farmington Hills Fire Department.

• GIRLS THREATENED

Two 16-year-old girls from Redford Township told officers they were threatened by five teenage males, one of whom wielded what was thought to be a pellet gun.

According to a Farmington Hills police report:

The girls were eastbound on Grand River when a car pulled up alongside near Orchard Lake Road and a rear-seat passenger pointed a gun at them and threatened them.

The girls tried to lose the trailing car, but couldn't. Near Colgate, a rear-seat passenger shot out the rear hatch window of the girls' car, then headed down a side street.

Pellet holes were found in the attacked car's trunk area.

The girls were not hurt.

road watch

Last September residents of Farmington Hills approved a \$7 million bond issue designed for major road improvements. Road work has begun and plans call for repairs and improvements to continue throughout the city for the next two years.

This, of course, will cause motorists some inconvenience as major roads are blocked off and normal driving routes are detoured. The end results, however, will be less congestion, better traffic capacity and improved road safety in the community. It's called progress, and the city administration asks for your patience and understanding through this road improvement plan of action.

Roads under construction:

- Truck Road between Eight Mile and Folsom is closed to through traffic until Nov. 1. The contractor is installing underground utilities.

- Ten Mile between Farmington and Power Roads was resurfaced this week.

- Drake Road between 13 and 14 Mile is closed until Nov. 1. All pipes have been installed and curb construction is scheduled this week.

- The intersection of Nine Mile and Haggerty is being widened on all four legs. Through traffic is being maintained. The project should be completed by Oct. 15. Currently, the contractor is placing the asphalt widenings.

- Halsted Road between 12 and 14 Mile is closed to through traffic. Pavement stripping and final cleanup and seeding are under way.

- 13 Mile between Halsted and Haggerty is closed to through traffic until Nov. 1. Curb construction is under way.

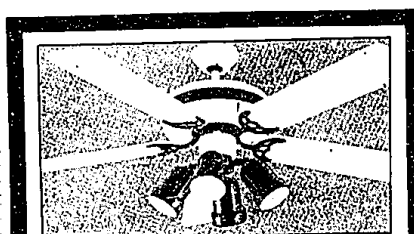
