A Detroit teenager faces charges in connection with the theft of a 1984 Poutine Fiero from Green Hill Apartments, Nine Mile and Halsted, shortly past midnight Nov. 1.

Arraigned Nov. 1 before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, the 17-year-old stood mute to one felony of unlawfully driving away an automobile and one misdemeanor count of failing to obey a police officer's signal.
