Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police, fire and court cases filed during the past week.

ROBBERY CONVICTION

An Oakland County Circuit Court jury convicted a 19-year-old Oak Park man for aiding and abetting in an armed robbery Aug. 22, 1986, at the McDonald's Restaurant, 10 Mile and Grand River.

The jury deliberated almost two hours before reaching a verdict Nov. 2. Circuit Judge Richard Kuhn will sentence Reginald Walter Gibson later this month.

Nobody was hurt in the stickup. Two men took an undisclosed amount of money at gunpoint, said Detective David Lee of the Farmington Hills Police Department.

SUSPECTS NABBED

A Detroit teenager faces charges in connection with the theft of a 1984 Pontiac Fiero from Green Hill Apartments, Nine Mile and Halsted, shortly past midnight Nov. 1.

Arrested Nov. 1 before District Judge Margaret Schaefer of Farmington, the 17-year-old stood mute to one felony of unlawfully driving away an automobile and one misdemeanor count of failing to obey a police officer's signal. Innocent pleas were entered. Bond was set at \$1,000 pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

The teenager faces up to five years in prison if convicted of the felony charge. The misdemeanor charge carries a penalty of up to one year in jail upon conviction.

An Oakland County Probate Court Juvenile Division petition will be filed against a 15-year-old boy from North Glenn, Colo., also in connection with the theft.

According to Farmington Hills police reports:

Officer Gilbert Kohls and Auxiliary Officer Steven McElvey were at Nine Mile and Farmington Road when they heard a broadcast describing a car that had just been reported stolen from Green Hill Apartments.

They spotted a Fiero matching the description waiting in the left-turn lane at that intersection. When they activated their marked patrol car's overhead lights, the Fiero's driver headed north on Farmington Road, allegedly disregarding two red lights.

At Shawasssee, the driver allegedly disregarded a stop sign, passed through the intersection and left the roadway, striking a flashing construction barricade, spinning and coming to rest on a wooden cement form.

Both occupants ran into a wooded area north of Shawasssee. A 15-year-old suspect was found in the brush. Kohls sustained head and hand cuts in making the arrest.

At 2 a.m., Farmington Department of Public Safety officers went to a house on Elizabeth Court where the homeowner had reported a suspicious teenager seeking help.

The teenager left when he learned the homeowner had called police. Soon after, Farmington Hills Officer Tim Swanson and Farmington Officer Vince Ziegler arrested him in a wooded area behind the 47th District Court.

CARS VANDALIZED

Five cars parked at Green Hill Apartments were vandalized between Oct. 31 and Nov. 1. Damage included tire punctures, a smashed window, a broken side mirror, a broken interior turn signal indicator and a missing hood emblem. 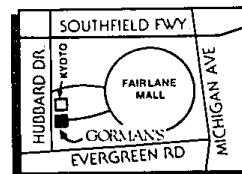
