



## Ski Heil

Someone stopped me the other day and asked, "What's a good ski?" He may as well have asked me what was a good car or what was a good tennis racket, because I'd have answered him the same way: "How much do you want to spend?" Of course there are other criteria for choosing skis, but basic dollar outlay does narrow one's choice somewhat.

I don't think there is such a thing as a "bad" pair of \$100 or \$200 skis. Then again, a \$200 pair of Kniesel Super Slide Downhill GTO's may not be a good ski for you if you have just been skiing at Mt. Brighton twice, on the beginners' run, but are hooked on the sport.

You should take several things into consideration before you charge into a ski shop with your money or your charge plate in your hot little hands.

What type of skier are you — beginner, novice, intermediate, advanced? How often do you ski? (If you only ski three weekends a season why invest all that money? Rent!) Where do you ski? Do you know that skis are made for various types of terrain and snow conditions? (Michigan "boiler plate" skiing is fantastically different from Alta "powder snow". The artificial snow of the Midwest is different from the high altitude snow of the Rockies.)

YOUR height and weight are also important in your choice of skis. If you take your height and weight and multiply your age by the number of seasons skied, plus your education, plus your intelligence quotient, and divide the total into your bank account, you'll have found the correct formula for basing your decision.

In other words, there are no easy answers. The only true solution is to go to a reputable ski shop, and there are dozens of them in Observerland.

Don't be in a great hurry. Ask questions. Be honest. Don't tell the salesman you ski like Stein

While the Glenn ball-carrying was divided among three men, Pettus was about the only Belleville back to touch the ball.
