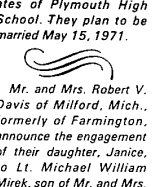

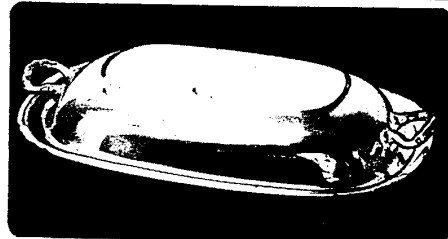
Slanaker-Fortner Rites Held
