Art Exhibits Are Sought For Train

All Michigan artists and craftsmen are invited to submit slides of their works to the Michigan Artrain, 113 Sherzer Hall, Eastern Michigan University, Ypsilanti, 48197.

The Michigan Artists' Exhibition is scheduled to begin rolling across the state late next spring aboard the Artrain.

ALL INTERESTED exhibitors are requested now to submit up to six representative 35mm color slides for jury consideration.

The slides must be properly identified with the artist's name, address, title, media and size of work. Slides chosen by the jury will become the property of Artrain and will be shown at each stop. One original work of art must be available to travel with the train.

Rejected slides will be returned.

Artrain is sponsored by the Michigan Council for the Arts, and consists of three coaches, including an art gallery, a baggage workshop and a caboose.

GREAT USE is made of audio-visual equipment in showing the history of art and its importance to man.

According to present plans, Artrain will begin its whistle-stopping tour the opening days of Michigan Week, May 1971. More than 80 communities have requested visits by the train.

Altar Is The Stage For Folk Rock Cantata

A musical extravaganza which combines a folk-rock cantata with a Broadway revue, music from the Roaring '20s and secular Christmas music, will be produced by a Southfield artist and teacher before the altar of St. Paul's Memorial Episcopal Church.

Producer Kathy MacLean, artist-teacher in piano, voice and choreography, says it will "be a first in the Detroit Metropolitan area."

An Episcopalian, she says, "It has been my desire for many years to present a religious nature in front of the altar, instead of building an altar on the stage. Now, with the approval of Fr. William Maddock and the church, I'm doing it."

CALLER "Rotzgrani," the program will be staged Sunday, Dec. 3, at 5 p.m., beginning in the parish hall with a Broadway revue on

Christmas giving. From there the audience is led into the church for a dramatized version of the folk-rock Christmas cantata, "Shepherd's Rejoice," performed with authentic costuming.

Starring in the production are Dr. Jack Warfield, of Southfield; Brian Gill, of Royal Oak; Ray Buchanan, of the Canadian Opera Company; the choir of St. Paul; the Katidiz and the Chorists.

Southfield residents taking part in the production, in addition to Miss MacLean, are Calvin MacLean, Karen Madeas, Sandy and Betty Plister, and Carol Stanton.

Other Observerland participants are Bess Edwards, of Livonia; Cathy Proctor, of Farmington; and Doris Meadows of Westland.

Rev. C. B. W. Maddock and Rev. Phil Hamilton, of St. Paul's Church, will also

play a part in the musical presentation.

Miss MacLean said the "whole Christmas package" was inspired the first time

she heard the rock cantata. She refers to Buchanan as her "special protégé." She is the director of the Chorists and the Katidiz.

"They represent all faiths and some of the participants will have their first experience in an Episcopal full professional," she says, "church members, altar boys and priests have all volunteered help."
