

## State Parks Use Booms To Record

LANSING Daily attendance and camping numbers, like the temperatures spurring them, are showing upward at state parks in Michigan this season and they appear well on their way to reaching record highs in 1970, reports the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

Figures tabulated by the DNR through late July show that Michigan's 76 administered state parks and recreation areas have drawn 11 mil-

lion day users, about 1 million more than a year ago.

Through that same period, state park workers issued more than 231,000 camping permits.

### Hamilton Earnings Set Mark

Hamilton International Corp., a financial holding company based in Farmington, whose principal subsidiary is Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance Co. of America, reported record net income for the third quarter and nine months ended Sept. 30.

For the third quarter, net income was \$1,149,888 or 17 cents per share, up sharply from a restated net of \$550,284, or four cents per share, for the same three months a year ago.

Earnings for the nine months period were \$1,901,493, or 28 cents per share, again a sharp gain over a restated net of \$407,654, or five cents per share, for the same period in 1969.

Total revenue for the first nine months of 1970 was a record \$24,000,730, compared to restated revenue of \$22,117,272 the year before. For the third quarter, total revenue was at an all-time high of \$8,374,628, compared to restated revenue of \$7,247,302, for the like period in 1969.

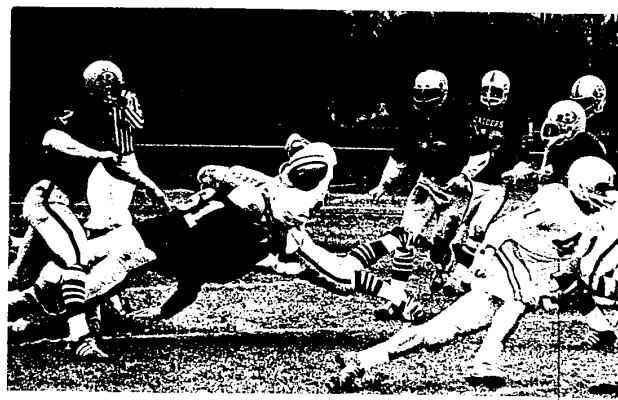

## U.S. May Pick Up College ROTC Tab

ANN ARBOR A formula for reimbursement of universities for costs of supporting ROTC programs is expected in the Defense Dept. appropriation request for fiscal 1972, according to University of Michigan President Robben W. Fleming.

We are advised that the Dept. of Defense has completed its internal study of costs," Fleming told U-M regents "and we believe the

department will approve some reimbursement formula, and that this formula will be forwarded to Congress for inclusion in the appropriations bill for the next fiscal year.

Cost reimbursement is the last item remaining in a series of recommendations on ROTC programs made last year by the U-M faculty Senate Assembly, except for selection now in process of two student members of a committee to have general supervisory responsibility for ROTC curricula and to pass on appointment of instructors.

Committee members already selected are Prof. Alan B. Macnee, engineering, and Terrance Sandalow, law, chosen from a panel of six faculty submitted by the Senate Advisory Committee on University Affairs; the chairman of the Dept. of Romance Languages.

### Plunkett Names New Assistant

Oakland County Prosecutor Thomas G. Plunkett has appointed A. David Baumhart III as an assistant prosecuting attorney.

Baumhart, 27, who completed his undergraduate work at Olivet College, is a graduate of the Vanderbilt University School of Law. Baumhart was campaign field director for U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin in the 1966 election and was research assistant for the minority staff of the U.S. House Education and Labor Committee in the summer of 1968.

Baumhart lives in Bloomfield Hills.
