
THE CITY council, based on city
administrators' recommendation,
also chose the third alternative as a
second choice if the fourth is not accepted. In October, following the
MDOT informational imeeting, Costicks said plan No. I was totally unacceptable. Plan No. 2 also is unacceptable because it doesn't provide

An environmental impact study is required by the Federal Highway Administration, which MDOT is relying on to help pay for Haggerty improvements. The highway administration will review the study's results as well as the improvement plan that's finally chosen, said Hank Lotoszinski, MDOT planner.



This is the plan for a new Haggerty Road parkway that the Farmington Hills City Council prefers. The plan calls for aligning the new M-9 west of the existing Haggerty Road, which would connect to the 1-960/1-275 interchange in the Ponitize Trail area. Existing Haggerty would remain as a service drive.

IN SEPTEMBER, Lotoszinski sald MDOT officials would like to hire a consultant to begin the environmental study in February. MDOT will then schedule public hearings once the impact study is complete for residents to review the results and the chosen plan.

idents to review the results and the chosen plan. Planning for Haggerty improve-ments has involved two committees, policy and technical, that were formed to help MDOT officials with the planning process and to provide an understanding of the local com-munities' concerns and desires.

Costick and Farmington Hills Mayor Ben Marks serve on the poli-cy committee. Farmington Hills also is represented on the technical com-mittee by some of the city's public services staff.

The planning process for provid-ing a connector from I-696/I-96/I-275 to Haggerty and north to Pontiac Trail is only one of two study efforts.

A second study will help determine the best place for the continua-tion of M-9 between I-96/I-696/I-275 and M-59.
