Thanks In Music To Be Featured In Plymouth

Two Detroit churches are joining forces again this Thanksgiving to celebrate the 350th anniversary of the landing of the Pilgrims.

First Congregational Church, Woodward and Forest, and Plymouth United Church of Christ, Garfield and Beaubien, will hold a special Thanksgiving service commencing with dinner at 6:30 p.m., Wednesday, Nov. 25, in First Congregational Church.

The pastor of Plymouth Church, Dr. Nicholas Hood, will be the principal speaker for the service at 7:30. A choir composed of members of both congregations will provide special music under the direction of Kendall B. Robertson, organist and choirmaster of First Church.

First Church was founded in 1844 and moved to its present location in 1891. Its minister is Dr. Erwin A. Britton. Plymouth Church was founded 51 years ago in the chapel of First Church.

35 Churches In Farmington Aid Rap Line

Thirty-five Farmington churches will join in sponsoring a Thanksgiving Eve service that will spread information about the community's drug control program.
