Mrs. Gendron's seven children live in an old house built on a "shaky" foundation. She plans to use a neighbor's dogs to keep the rats from eating through the basement walls.

"I can show you the rat holes," she said. "They live in the swamps and fields behind us and come up to the houses for food."

Mrs. Gendron has a three-month old baby.

IT TAKES money for garbage pickup to supplement the monthly pickups supplied by Farmington Township. And so Mrs. Gendron, like most of the families here, puts her garbage out only once a month.

She says no one has collected any garbage from her house in over four months.

"They don't seem to bother with us, so our garbage is piled up in bags outside the house."

She, Mrs. Trisdale and Mrs. Louvernia Barnett, of 21697 Roosevelt, describe swamps in the area that have never been cleared after the houses were built. "Children play in these swamps," they said.

"Roads are graded in the area, but 'every spring we have to park our cars on Grand River and walk up to our houses. The mud is so deep you could never get a car through there.'"

Ditches constantly overflow and culverts never seem to do the job, says Mrs. Trisdale.
