JILL ESTEY, Plymouth Salem: The speedy point-guard averaged 12 points per game, but was noted for her dolt ball-handling skills.

The All-Western Lakes Conference pick led the Rocks in assists, including a game-high 21 this season.

"She is a premier point-guard who can take the ball from end to end as well as anybody in the state," Thomason said.

"She's versatile with either hand. She can dribble behind her back and between her legs without losing speed."

"She's coming a long way in developing a perimeter shot. If you get open, and are in range to score, she'll put you the basketball on time."

Estey was voted the state's top soccer player last year as a sophomore, leading the Rocks to the Class A crown.

KATIE McNULTY, Livonia Ladywood: The 6-2 senior center averaged 15.3 points per game, shooting 53 percent from the floor and 71 percent from the free throw line this season. She also averaged 10.7 rebounds per game and 4.1 blocks.

The All-Central Division and All-Catholic League pick was a two-year starter for the Blazers.

"Katie is a very coachable young lady," said coach Ed Kavanaugh. "Her assets are her versatility, ability to use both hands and strength. She is constantly improving and her best years are ahead of her. Katie has expanded her game in all areas."

JAN HERBERHOLZ, Farmington Mercy: Seventh on Mercy's all-time scoring list with 650 points, the 5-foot-9 forward averaged 14.3 points as a senior, along with 4.2 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game.

She is an All-Central Division and All-Catholic League pick.

Said coach Larry Baker of his co-captain: "In 1987 Jan developed into an outstanding all-around player. Her consistent play and on-court leadership was a key to our success. She turned in two outstanding performances against Plymouth Salem."

KAREN BOLUCH, Plymouth Canton: A three-year starter, Boluch was named to the All-Western Lakes Conference team this season, averaging 12.8 points and 12.5 rebounds per game. She also has a total of 63 assists and 42 steals.

"Karen has played every position on the court," said Canton coach Rob Nou. "She can score inside and out, pass the ball, rebound and check the opponent's best player."

The Canton co-captain was also named to the all-tournament team at the Mercy Hoops Classic.

BETH WILSON, Westland John Glenn: The 5-8 senior guard scored 374 points, for an 18.7 average. Her free throw percentage was outstanding, 78 percent. She also averaged 6.6 rebounds per game.

A two-time All-Lakes Division pick and team MVP, O'Beir was the Patriots' mainstay.

"She is a complete player," said Franklin coach Dan Freeman. "She can play facing the basket or with her back to the basket. She can hit the three-point shot (13 on the year) or drive for the layup."

"She has been a delight to coach. I have had few athletes who have been what Rose has. Franklin will really miss her."

ROSE O'BEIR, Livonia Franklin: The 5-9 senior guard-forward is a three-year starter.

**DENNY RAPAL**  
West Bloomfield

Rapal won four rather easy 98-pound matches before facing his toughest test in the championship match against Holly's Kirk Garner.

The Laker lightweight defeated Garner, 4-3. Garner walked into the final round with a 9-0 victory over T.S. Baughman of Hazel Park, while Rapal took Walled Lake Central's Soren Murphy in a pin at 1:05.

Rapal won three rounds in Friday's opening matches. He defeated Novy's Chris Conrad and Kimball's Adam Gray in respective falls of 36 and 25 seconds. He qualified for Saturday's finals with a 15-0 technical fall over Bill Loyas of Milford-Lake.

DAN MATHER  
Avondale

Mather was hardly tested in winning the 138-pound championship. A state 126-pound runner-up last year, Mather defeated Royal Oak Dondoro's Jim Dorsett in the championship match by a 18-3 technical fall. The Avondale junior won a 9-1 major decision over Royal Oak Kimball's Joe Guettler in the semifinals.

His three wins on Friday were by lopsided scores of 19-8 (Brian Crysb of Walled Lake Central) and 24-7 (Scott Taylor of Our Lady of the Lakes), plus a 2-0 pin over Rochester Adams' Steve Casavoy.

The wins lifted Mather's record this year to a perfect 16-0. Mather, the 126-pound county champ in 1986, finished last season with an overall 52-2-1.

"I don't see where (Dan) had a tough match. He was never in a situation where he was threatened to lose," said Avondale coach Ray Went. "When he didn't pin his opponent, he outpointed them to the point where he was never in danger of losing."

"Dan is a talented young man and an excellent competitor," he said. "He has a good, sound technique. He doesn't do a lot of fancy things, he just does a lot of things well."

**SHANE CAMERA**  
Rochester

Camera, the defending Class A state and county champion at 167 pounds, didn't even wrestle his championship match. He won by default over Avondale's Dale Wright.

Camera's semifinal victory was a 15-0 thumping over Milford's Aaron Strand. His closest tourney match was in the quarterfinals where he edged Milford-Lake's Jim Hake, 4-3. Camera, a junior, registered pins in his first two matches over Bryan Walter of Farmington (3:36) and Chris Lang of Troy Athens (3:09).

The wins lifted Camera's overall mark this season to 16-0.

"That one 4-3 score was a fairly tough match, but I don't think it was as light as the score indicated," said Rochester coach Bob Cheney. "I think Shane pretty much dominated the match."

"It was a typical Shane performance," he said. "Sometimes he has tough matches with the easy guys, but he really gets up for the big matches."

THE PLANNING COMMISSION of the City of Farmington will hold a PUBLIC HEARING on MONDAY, JANUARY 11, 1988, at 8:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan, for the purpose of reviewing proposed amendments to the City of Farmington Zoning Ordinance.  
The City of Farmington Planning Commission, as required by Title V, Chapter 39, Section 5.142 of the Zoning Ordinance, has completed a comprehensive review of the Zoning Ordinance. As a result of this review amendments and changes are proposed in the Zoning Ordinance.
