The eight movements in this collection offered a manifestation of Villa-Lobos skill and talent in musical painting. Varani appeared in few of these most interest players.

AN ENCORE provided a brief treak from the music of Villa-Lobos with a piece from the Boeuf sur la Totts by Darius Milhaud, who spent many of his years in Brazil.


