

Farmington police hired 5 in 1987

Three new officers and two new dispatchers were hired at Farmington's public safety department during 1987, according to director Frank Lauboff.

Several assignment changes were also made during the past year. Hired Dec. 14 was Officer Christine Guinan of Chelsea. Guinan attended the Grand Valley Police Academy and Grand Valley State College, where she received a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. Guinan will be in training for three months.

She replaces Officer Tony Gubacz, who has been assigned to represent Farmington on a recently established area auto theft prevention unit based in Novi.

Other new officers include Farmington Hills resident Robert Schulz, hired Mar. 30, and Novi resident Terrence Purves, hired Mar. 23. Both attended Delta College and Ferris State and held bachelor's degrees in criminal justice.

STUDENT DETAINED

Peetung Lee, 17, was filed in Oakland County Probate Court for a 16-year-old Southfield youth after an incident in which Farmington school property was damaged and Farmington public safety officers assaulted, Dec. 22.

VIOLATION REPORTED

A complaint was filed with the state Liquor Control Commission about a Farmington convenience store, which sold beer and wine on Christmas Day, an act prohibited by law.

Residents reported Dairy Mart Convenience Store, 20750 Farmington Road just north of Eight Mile, was selling beer and wine on the holiday, a report from the Farmington Department of Public Safety said. An employee said she was not aware selling the alcoholic beverages was prohibited.

VIOLATION ISSUED

A 19-year-old Northville man was ticketed under the Farmington Hills host liability ordinance for renting a room in which minors were served alcoholic beverages Dec. 27 at the Red Roof Inn, 24300 Sinauola Court.

The man was ticketed after a Farmington Hills police officer and security guard knocked on the door and found him and about 10 minors in the room with alcoholic beverages, according to a police report.

The city ordinance prohibits adults age 17 or older who knowingly allow minors to consume alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs at parties or gatherings under their control — and fail to take corrective steps. The ordinance is brooded in April to include gatherings at hotels, motels and rental properties.

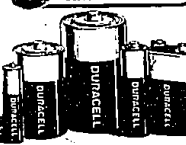

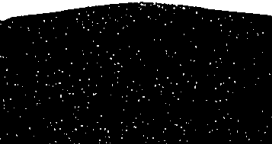

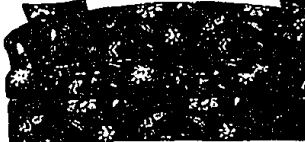
