# Unused research a pointless waste

The first step of the decison-mak-

The first step of the decison-making process is to recegize and identify what specific problem or opportunity exists and requires further action. Sales may be up, but no one really knows why.

Rather than hoping the trend continues, marketing research may be used to help identify what factors may be contributing to an increase in sales, while uncovering related opportunities that may have otherwise been ignored.

Next, management must identify alternative courses of action. Doing nothing is just as much a course of action as to increase advertising, for

Exploratory research may be used to help managers not only recognize

and identify areas of problem and opportunity but also provide alterna-tive courses of action that may be evaluated later on in the research

evaluated later on in the research process.

Exploratory research is appropriate during these early phases of the decison-making process and is designed to obtain a preliminary analysis of the situation with a minimum expenditure of time and cest.

The common methods used to earry out exploratory research include focus group interviews, searching published data sources, observation, case histories, and interviews with experts.

Once alternative actions have been identified, conclusive research may then be conducted to provide information which helps management evaluate and then select a specific

evaluate and then select a specific course of action.

Possible research methods include customer surveys, experiments, simulations and observation. Next week, we will conclude our discussion on marketing research for independent businesses.
