filed a lawsuit seeking \$80,000 from the Bowerbank estate. Clark's suit included a request for \$1,000 for medical services he rendered Mrs. Bowerbank and her mother, Mrs. Ellen Winsper, now past 80 years old.

In the suit, Clark asked the court to declare him owner of two lots at 30735 Grand River, Farmington Township, then valued at \$20,000; 65 shares of stock in 13 separate companies then worth \$43,000; \$5,000 cash; \$1,200 worth of jewelry; a 1964 Plymouth Fury then valued at \$1,200 and a coin collection then valued at \$3,000.

Davis On Ship

Navy Petty Officer 3-C Neil A. Davis, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ken Harden of 22488 Violet, Farmington, and husband of the former Nancy J. Winters of 34016 Richmond, Farmington, is serving aboard the amphibious assault ship USS Tripoli at San Diego, Calif.

Neil's death, the body of Mrs. Bowerbank was exhumed in November 1968. The body was dug up at the request of Lt. Russ Conway, Farmington Township Detective.

An autopsy performed then indicated there were traces of sodium pentothal in Mrs. Bowerbank's brain.

The Oakland County Prosecutor's office, then headed by S. Jerome Bronson, determined from the autopsy that Mrs. Bowerbank did not die of natural causes.

In January, 1969, Bronson called in Dr. Frederick Rieders, a nationally prominent

drug expert, to investigate the findings of the autopsy. Dr. Rieders stated that sodium pentothal was "a competent cause of death" in the Bowerbank case. Clark is a member of the Bahai faith, which believes in the oneness of humanity.

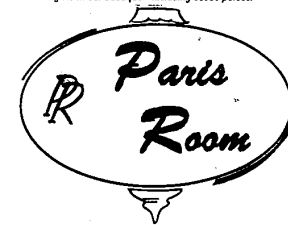

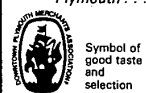
