300 Singers To Perform Oratorio In Ann Arbor

ANN ARBOR — Handel's "Messiah," performed by the 300 singers of the University Choral Union and guest soloists, accompanied by members of the Interlochen Arts Academy Orchestra, will usher in the Christmas season at the University of Michigan on Dec. 4, 5 and 6.

Performances on Dec. 4 and 5 will be at 8:30 p.m. and on Dec. 6 at 2:30 p.m. in Hill Auditorium. The oratorio, which has been a tradition of the University Choral Union since 1879, will be presented under auspices of the University Musical Society.

Tickets are available in the offices of the Society, Burton Tower, 665-3717. This year's presentation, again conducted by Donald Bryant, will feature soprano Lucia Evangelista, contralto Elaine Bonazzi, tenor John McCollum, and bass Jerome Hines. Mary McCall Stubbs will play the organ and Charles Fisher the harpsichord. The Dec. 5 evening performance will be broadcast live over U-M radio station WJOM in Ann Arbor and WVGR in Grand Rapids.

INTERLOCHEN ARTS Academy Orchestra has been previously acclaimed for its performances in New York's Lincoln Center, in Chicago, Washington and elsewhere under Thior Johnson and founder Joseph E. Maddy. The highly trained musicians, aged 14 to 19, are all studying toward a career in professional music. They perform weekly concerts at Interlochen.

Soprano Lucia Evangelista, after singing operatic roles throughout Italy, came to America in 1946 and was signed by the New York City Center Opera Company. Since then she has sung in practically all of America's major cities and opera companies including Philadelphia, San Francisco and the Cincinnati Summer Opera Company. She married Jerome Hines in 1952.

Contralto Elaine Bonazzi is a frequent guest artist with such major orchestras as the Detroit Symphony, the Philadelphia Orchestra, the American Symphony, the Cincinnati Symphony and the Cleveland Orchestra. She has appeared for five consecutive seasons at the famed Bethlehem Bach Festival.

TENOR JOHN McCOLLUM has appeared with many important orchestras in all the great works ranging from Bach to Rossini to Verdi to Britten and Stravinsky. He has also starred with the New York City Opera and the opera companies of NBC-TV, Central City, Washington, D.C., and Canada, and is heard regularly in recital throughout the country. He is head of the voice department of the U-M School of Music.

Jerome Hines, bass, has sung as soloist with all the major orchestras of the U.S., Europe and South America.

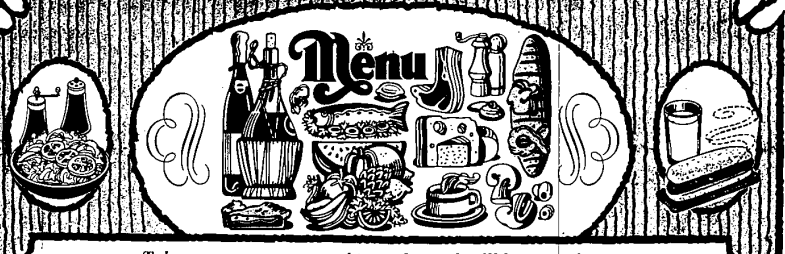

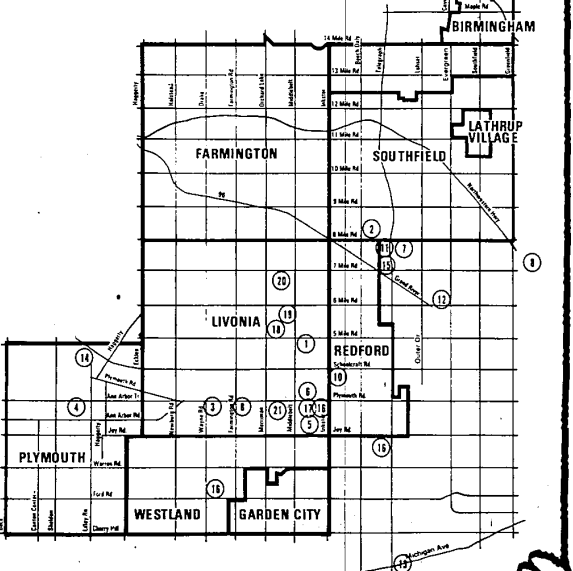
