## Bye Bye Birdie

Students stage rock and roll spoof

A 71-member cast backed by a crew of 45 will come to Mercy High School from 17 surrounding communities to produce the musical rock and roll spoof of the '60s, "Bye Bye Birdie."

Showtime is 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday, and at 3 p.m. Sunday in the school, on the corner of 11 Mile and Middlebelt Road.

"The show was set in 1960 but we pushed it up to 1963," said Roberta Campion, who has been producer, director and choreographer for the high school's spring musicals for the past five years. "That way we could include the twist, the monkey and the jerk. We have a cha-cha number, some jazz and a lot of rock and roll."

Remembered show tunes from the musical are "A Lot of Livin' To Do," "Put on a Happy Face," and "Kids." The show's biggest production number is "The Telephone Hour."

"This show is by far the all-time favorite of high school casts everywhere," Campion said. "The musical has extremely wide audience appeal to people of all ages."

Campion's co-producers are Larry Tevens, vocal director, and Ron Sill, the technical director. Vincie Misura is the production stage manager and June Williams is the accompanist. The Matt Michaels Quintette will be in the orchestra pit with Tevens.


