

## Baker Puts Up \$1,317 For Victory

State Rep. Raymond L. Baker (R-Farmington) won re-election after spending \$1,137, of which only \$890 was from contributors.

His Democratic opponent, Leonard P. Baruch of South-field, failed to file by dead-line Nov. 23 with the Oakland County clerk.

The law requires all candidates and committees for candidates to file within 20 days of the general election. Tardiness is common, however, and clerks can't remember anyone ever being prosecuted for failure to file or tardiness.

Baker reported receiving one \$150 contribution, from E. C. Kennard of Flint; three \$100 contributions, from Paul Lahti off Royal Oak, R. G. Bradley of Lansing and J. J. Bargoyine of Plymouth Livonia; and \$50 from the Michigan Apothecary Political Action Committee.


