The \$4.4 billion laboratory would generate 10,000 construction jobs during the three-seven years it will take to build, Drucke told the South Oakland County Municipal Engi-neers meeting.

It was one of more than 200 pres-entations the electric and gas utility has made to 10,000 people in order to durum up political support for the project, which would be under the larm lands of Ingham and Jackson counties.

Lis. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, said, "There would be a great deal of research that would have spin-off benefits to the University of Michigan and Michigan State."

Companies such as Greenfield Construction of Livonia would have a good chance for federal contracts, said Pursell, the only Michiganian on the House Appropriations subcommittee, which will appropriate the money for the project.

The project will start in the House Energy and Commerce Committee headed by John Dingell, D-Trenton.

THE SUPER COLLIDER, if built, would be a tunnel 53 miles in circumference and 150 feet underground for basic research into the

ground for bear.

"It can be thought of as a race course filled with magnets." Drucke said. "The magnets are used to acclerate protons one way and anti-protons the other. They will travel in opposite directions at great speeds through a tunnel 12 feet in diameter and will collide."

He likened it to a microscope that studies the material secrets of the universe. "Physicists want to get to the heart of matter. They think smaller and smaller," he quipped.
