L. Brooks Patterson, "the crime victim's attorney," won't run for a fifth term as Oakland County pro-secutor and will support his chief deputy, Richard Thompson, for the four-year post.

"It's time to move on ," said Patterson, announcing that on Jan. I he will join the Birmingham law off-ice of Barbier, Petersmarck, Tolle-son, Mead, Palge & Carlin.

Although he will continue to man-age George Bush's Republican presi-dential campaign in Michigan, Patterson, 49, ruled out a job in Washington If Bush wins.

PETER BARBIER, head of the 44-lawyer firm, said Patterson brings it a reputation — "not just a big name" — as a top trial lawyer.

The firm does defense work in medical malpractice cases and corporate work.

"There's little difference" between prosecuting and private practice in courtroom and appellate work, Barbier said.

Pattersofo, his voice sometimes choking with emotion, announced at a Wednesday news conference, attended by supporters and GOP officials, that Barbier wanted him to leave office before his term was up and join the firm immediately.

"But I want the public to pick my successor, II I resigned, the courts would pick my successor," said Patterson, a frequent vocal critic of judges.

He sald he would work hard for Thompson but acknowledged "three or four other candidates" were good.
He said Thompson has been "at the heart and soul of my programs and has taken some hits for me."

THOMPSON said be would announce his candidacy for the Republican nomination in a couple of weeks, adding his legislative agenda would be the same as Patterson's — stiff mandatory sentences, no pleabargaining, with drug cases as a priority.
