Selecting gifts for attendants

You'll want to give a small gift to each of your attendants to show your appreciation — and as a keepsake of your wedding.

Alice Koltos of Lenox China & Crystal says the gift should be something personal that will last forever. She suggests an elegant fragrance bottle, delicately painted jewelry tray or bud vase.

Traditionally, each bridesmaid gets an identical gift and honor attendants receive something a little more special.

Many brides choose a gift item that can be worn to the wedding — a bracelet engraved with the date of the wedding, gloves, earrings or a necklace with a single pearl.

THIS IS NOT A hard-and-fast rule, however. Feel free to give a more per-

sonal gift — theater tickets, a basket of gourmet treats, a coveted tennis racket.

The same is true for your groom's ushers and best man. He can give individual gifts or items like cuff links and tie bars that can be worn to the wedding. Men's gifts that monogram nicely are money clips, belt buckles, key rings and pewter mugs.

Monogramming also works well for women's pendants, business card or contact lens cases and silver hair combs.

Traditionally, attendants receive their gifts during the rehearsal dinner, the night before the wedding day. You can also give gifts at the bridesmaids' luncheon or afternoon tea, a week before the wedding.
