Singer and pianist join for an evening of cabaret

Farmington Community Center will host "An Evening of Cabaret" starring songstress Sheri Nichols and pianist Richard Berent at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, May 22. Tickets for the event are \$13 and are available in the center, 24705 Farmington Road.



Farmington Community Center's living room will be converted into a cabaret theater for the evening of music performed by pianist Richard Berent and songstress Sheri Nichols.

The show, presented in the intimate atmosphere of the center's living room, is a repertoire of Broadway melodies, some impressions and Nichols' talent for bringing the audience emotionally into the performance.

Tables will be set up cabaret style with white linens and candles to promote a club or cafe atmosphere. For an additional \$3, a meal is available during the performance.

Nichols will be performing selections from three of her concert programs. They include, "An Evening of Edith Piaf," "Gershwin Gals," and "The Best of Broadway." "An Evening of Cabaret" will combine dramatic renditions of Broadway favorites, rarely heard novelty numbers, passionate torch songs and charming nostalgia.

Nichols made headlines in 1985 in the starring role of Pam Gern, "Piaf" at the Attic Theater in Detroit, a performance which earned her the award as "Best Actress" in a ceremony co-sponsored by the Detroit Free Press and The Professional Theater League of Greater Detroit.

A veteran of many cabaret productions, her credits include Phil Esser's revue, "1945 Detroit, Sheri Nichols Downtown," "Broadway Babies" at Tremont's Supper Club and last year's Attic Theater Christmas hit, "Holiday Cabaret: Expectations."

"An Evening of Cabaret" continues Farmington Community Center's series of cultural offerings, according to Robert Striks, the center's director of public relations. He said the programs like "An Evening of Cabaret," "Family Desert Theater," "The J.C. Heard Big Band" and "A Salute to Broadway" set a high standard of providing quality and creative entertainment. He said local concert-goers like the intimacy and atmosphere that the center provides.

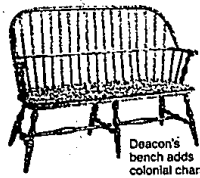
