Livonia Ladywood battled state-ranked Birmingham Marian to a scoreless tie Saturday in girls soccer at Livonia's Bicentennial Park.

Both teams had their scoring chances. Marian, which advanced to the Catholic League tournament finals with an overtime win over Farmington Hills Mercy Monday, missed on a penalty kick and Ladywood (4-3-1 overall) failed to capitalize on three solid opportunities.

"The girls are looking for some respect because the season has been so-so," said Ladywood coach John Ozog, whose team finished 3-3-1 in the league. "I'm stepped up to the challenge. We had our chances but couldn't put the ball into the net. But we held them off."

On Thursday, Cassie Ozog pumped in three goals and Gina Carozzo contributed two to pace Ladywood's 7-0 trouncing of Allen Park Cabrini at Bicentennial Park.

Maddie Verrino and Amy Boues also notched goals for Ladywood.

Hunt and Walter were on the fifth-place squad in the distance medley, too. Hunt ran 600 meters, Walter 400, Matt Walter 1,200 and Ron Smedley 1,600 for a cumulative time of 11:05.8.

Matt Walker, Ron Smedley and London teamed with Steve Queen-

ville for fifth place in the four-mile relay (18:50.9), and the Falcons were sixth in the long jump at 55-0. Wright had a team-best jump of 19 feet.

North was fourth in the 800 relay and fifth in the sprint medley.
