

Blue Jays are best in county

Earlier this season Troy track coach John Bancroft said the Southfield boys track team was "the best team in the county." That was after the Blue Jays breezed past Bancroft's Colts 82-46 in a dual meet.

Last Friday the Jays' proved Bancroft correct scoring 107 points to win the boys division of Oakland County Track and Field Championships. Pontiac Central finished a distant second with 68 points followed by (Class B) Oxford with 54 and Pontiac Northern with 28. No other school scored more than 22 points and 10 schools failed to score.

In the girls meet the race was much closer. Rochester Adams topped the field with 68 points and Troy was close behind, finishing second with 65. Four-time defending state Class C champion DeWitt Country Day placed third with 58 points followed by Pontiac Northern with 30. West Bloomfield with 26 and Rochester with 25. No other school scored more than 22 points and 13 schools failed to score.

CASSIDY WRIGHT led the Blue Jays' charge with three individual victories. The senior speedster won the 100 hurdles in 14.5, the 300 hurdles in 38.3 and the 400 dash in 49.4.

Bobby Johnson, Marvin Reynolds, Ron Halrston and Jason Booker teamed to set a new county record, winning the 800 relay in 1:27.8. Johnson, Jeff Reynolds, Halrston and Marvin Reynolds combined efforts to set another county record, winning the 400 relay in 42.4.

Johnson added a first place finish in the 100 in 10.8. Other top scorers for the Blue Jays include second place finishes by Ricky Duncan in the high jump (6-5), Jeff Reynolds in the 100 (10.9) and 200 (2.1) and the 1,600 relay team (3:23.3). Rich Williams picked up a third in the discus (150-9). Jason Booker finished fourth in the 200 (22.4) and James Booker placed fifth in the 100 hurdles (14.8) sixth

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place finishes went to Halrston in the 200 (22.8), David Ardayfio in the high jump (6-3) and the Jays' 3,200 relay team (8:05.4).

SCOTT PLAYER led Troy's scoring, finishing second in the discus (153-5) and third in the shot (49-9). The Colts' 3,200 relay team finished second (7:52.7).

Other local athletes placing in the top three in their respective events include John Collins of Birmingham Brother Rice, first in the discus (156-5); Dan Reddan of Rochester, first in the high jump (6-9); Ues the county record; Jeff Jefferson of Orchard Lake St. Mary's, first in the long jump (22-5.1) and Rick's team of Matt Brown, Dave Green, John Koppin and Mike Barry with a county record in the 3,200 (7:52.4).

Two other county records fell at Friday's meet. Pontiac Central set a record mark in the 1,600 relay with a 3:20.5 clocking and Walpole Lake Western's Brian Grosso set a new record in the 3,200 in 9:01.8.

KARIN SPIERS set the pace for Adams in the girls meet winning the 300 hurdles (45.1) and fin-

ishing second in the 100 hurdles (14.9). The team of Nikki Bandeleon, Spiers, Donna Christian and Krista Bowers added a first place in the 400 relay (50.4).

Melicia Whitl added a second place in the long jump (18-10). Third place finishes went to Bandeleon in the 200 (25.3), Bowers in the 100 (12.4), the 1,600 relay team (8:05.8) and the 800 relay team (1:45.1). The Highlanders' 3,200 relay team finished fourth (9:49.9), Bandeleon finished fifth in the 100 (12.9), Nancy Spite placed sixth in the 200 (11:47.4) and Shelley Bennett added a sixth place finish in the 1,600 (5:28.6).

Despite finishing the meet with four first-place finishes, including three county records, the Colts had to settle for second place in the team standings.

KRISTIE WESTERBY turned in a county meet record 2:13.5 to win the 800, the team of Anna Jontony, Kristi McKimmon, Jenny Holder and Westerby won the 3,200 relay with a record time of 9:25 and Jontony and McKimmon teamed up with Angela Knox and Westerby to set a record in the 1,600 relay at 4:00.3.

Jontony added a victory in the 400 (59.4), Knox finished second in the 200 (28.2) and the 100 (12.2), and Cindy Stockamp placed third in the long jump (15-9).

Shirley Evans dominated the sprints for Country Day winning both the 100 (12.1) and the 200 (25.4). Hameera Newman added a second in the 300 hurdles (45.6), DCD's 1,600 relay team also finished second (4:04.0) as did the Yellow Jackets' 800 relay team (1:45.1).

Other local runners placing in the top three include West Bloomfield's Stacy Abbott, first in the 1,600 (5:35.4); Birmingham Seaholm's Christine Johnson, first in the long jump (16-0); West Bloomfield's Tracy Abbott, second in the 3,200 (11:31.4); West Bloomfield's 3,200 relay team, second (9:43.3); Rochester's 3,200 relay team, third (9:45.9) and Rochester's Amy Heath, third in the 1,600 (5:28.5).

Farmington Mercy's track and field team has made great strides in the past year, and the results of the Catholic League meet are proof of that.

The Marlies added 65 points to their total from a year ago and jumped six places in the team standings at the league contest last Tuesday.

Mercy, which finished ninth and had just 114 points in 1987, moved up to challenge perennial powers Redford Bishop Borgess and Dearborn Divine Child for the top spots. The third-place Marlies had 76 1/2 points this time around.

Borgess and Divine Child traded places with the Spartans scoring 180 points to win the meet. The defending champion Falcons finished just 6 1/2 points ahead of Mercy.

"IT'S BEEN A really good year, and it's going to be really exciting next year, too," coach Gary Serravallo said, noting the large number of athletes who will return next season.

Serravallo also attributes the team's success, which includes a regional championship, to his assistant coaches and Farmington High School for allowing Mercy to use its track for practice and dual meets.

Serravallo has been assisted by Laura Smith, who works with the girls, and David Bower and Caroline Wright. The latter two special-

ize in instructing the shot-putters and discus throwers, respectively.

The 800 relay squad of Amaze, Brown, Smith and Mello was fourth as was Gates in the 800 run (3:38.0) and Gail Murre in the high jump (4-6).

Mercy's fifth places included Brigitte Dery in the 3,200 run (12:23.0), Barb Cheaney in the 800 run (3:38.0) and Bernadette Raymond in the long jump (15-4 1/2).

The Marlies also had three special places: Carolyn Serranjan in the long jump (15-3), Hood in the 400 dash (1:04.3) and Gerbig in the 3,200 (12:35.0).

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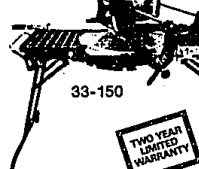
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
