



MANAGER MAYO SMITH
Gets the job done in two short years

When the Tigers trot out on the field in Busch Stadium in St. Louis Wednesday to engage the Cardinals in the first game of the world series they will be furnishing positive proof that Mayo Smith got his job done.

For the greater part of the past two seasons the critics have been making him a target, first because the Tigers failed a year ago after coming so close and then for his platooning of players and his haste in changing pitchers.

ALL THE WHILE Mayo said nothing and his silence recalled the day, early in the spring of 1967 when he was introduced to the members of the press as the new manager of the Tigers.

In introducing him, Jim Campbell, general manager of the Tigers, stated that he thought the club finally

had found the type of manager who could get the job done. He meant winning the pennant, of course.

As Mayo acknowledged the introduction and faced the press for the first time he boldly announced that he was planning one or two major shifts in personnel, and if the experiment worked, he was positive the team could go on to the pennant.

"I am going to play Dick McAuliffe at second base," he said. "And Ray Oyler at short and this could do the trick."

It was a stunning announcement as McAuliffe had been playing well at short and it was known that Oyler wasn't much of a hitter.

"What if you make these shifts and don't get the job

done?" the Bengal manager was asked.

"That will be entirely up to the management," Mayo answered with the air of a man who had no doubt that he could lead the team to the pennant.

Mayo finally got the job done.

Now history is repeating. He's faced with the task of winning the World Series --

and he's juggling the players again.

TO FIND A place in the starting lineup for Al Kaline, he has been playing Mickey Stanley at short-stop and chances are Mickey will get the call for the series opener.

It is a big gamble -- like shift of McAuliffe at the start of the 1967 season.

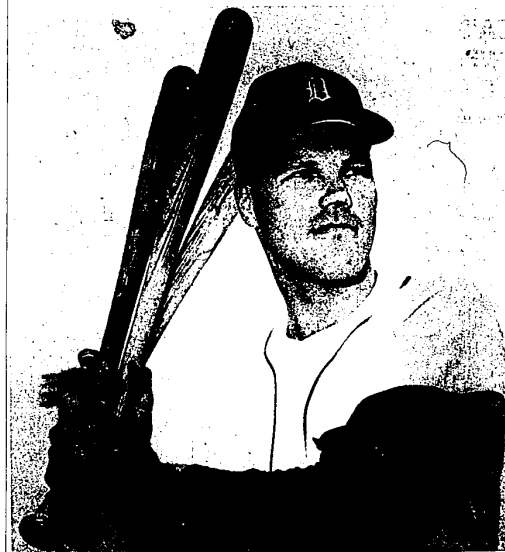
