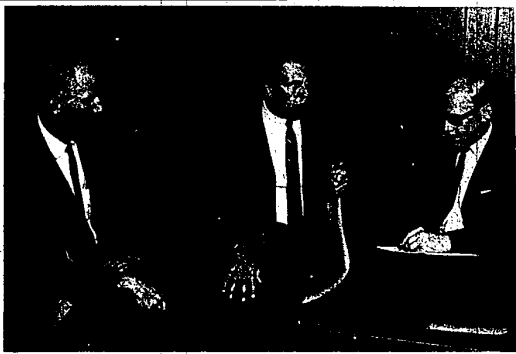
Paragraph three of the above mentioned notice of sale as published in the September 15, 1968 issue of the Farmington Enterprise & Observer is amended to read as follows:

Farmington Answers Queries From Sweden

Sweden came to Farmington this week to learn about the development of industrial parks.

Bengt Ringberg, an industrial development consultant from Stockholm, spent Tuesday afternoon in Farmington's Freeway Industrial Park.

He had a series of questions for William W. Bowman, executive vice president of Thompson Brown and the man behind the park development.

The Enterprise & Observer had a series of questions for him.

Ringberg is hoping to develop a 300-acre industrial park about 15 miles from Stockholm and his questions to Bowman were centered around the best means to sell lots in an industrial park.

He wanted to know about the planning required for the development of the park.

WHAT ABOUT industry in Sweden?

Ringberg said that Swedish industry is "cold and narrow" in its building. He explained that the buildings housing Swedish industry are landlocked in the city and in order to expand it's necessary to move to the outskirts.

Sound similar to the move from city to suburb of American industry?

"Sweden is a fairly small country with 113,000 square miles and seven and a half million people," he explained. "This we have a great deal of space, but the people have a strong demand for individual services.

"The people who would work in the industrial plants would want public transportation to their jobs," he said. "This fact stands in contrast to Sweden's highest per capita auto ownership in Western Europe).

Ringberg added the people would also demand social and consumer services. This has led to the development of what are called "functional regions of about 50,000 people" in order to meet all these needs.

In fact that Stockholm industrial development goes hand in hand with the construction of homes for those working in the industrial development.

Ringberg asked Bowman if there was a similar kind of movement in Farmington, Bowman told him that one of Thompson-Brown's advantages in developing the industrial park is the fact that the company also operates a real estate business.

"This we can help workers find housing," Bowman said with a grin.

MUCH OF Swedish industry has moved to West Germany and other parts of Western Europe because of the manpower shortage since the end of World War II.

Since 1945 Swedish industries building on foreign soil have created 600,000 jobs, while foreign industries locating in Sweden have created only 70,000 jobs.

"This there is a two-fold reason behind Ringberg's month-and-a-half trip to the United States. He's looking for ideas, but he is also looking for industries to come to Sweden and for possibilities for Swedish goods to be sold here.

Iron ore and the large forests still standing are Sweden's main natural resources. The two major industries are steel and wood-working. Swedish steel is imported into the U.S.

Ringberg says that American companies manufacturing consumer goods would have marketing possibilities in his country.

"I'm not sure that we would like 20 different brands of corn flakes on the store shelves,"




