

Checkmates Will Open New Pavilion Room

Lofy's opens its all-new, 400-seat Pavilion Room Thursday, Dec. 10, with the appearance of the internationally-known Checkmates, Ltd.

Lofy's, owned by Samuel Hados, is located in Plymouth at 42300 Ann Arbor Rd. The new night club will perform in the new night club six nights a week until Dec. 23.

THE GROUP, headed by talented Bobby Stevens, is best known for its gold recording of "Black Pearl." They hit the big time at Caesar's Palace in Las Vegas a few years back. Since then they have been seen on many major television variety shows, including Dean

Martin's and Johnny Carson's. Fred Solomon, Lofy's general manager, reports that 70 per cent of the seating capacity in the new Pavilion Room is no more than 50 feet from the stage, with no obstruction to viewing.

There is also a bar with good seats and a terrace for the remaining audience. The Pavilion Room is decorated in blue and red trimmed with gold, and with graceful white columns suggesting Roman elegance.

DINNER-DANCING will begin at 8:30 each evening, with the first show going on at 9. This performance will last until 10 or 10:15.

The second show is slated to begin at 11:30. Between performances, there will be music for dancing.

The Checkmates, Ltd., will be followed by the Unusual We, who will be in the Pavilion Room Dec. 26 through Jan. 20.

The Unusual We, a group of eight singers, were a box-office smash in Detroit in midsummer when they appeared at the Fisher Theatre. They have recently been seen on both the Tom Jones and Della Reese shows.

Succeeding the Unusual We, the record-making Plat-

Slate Auditions For Jazz Band

Two-hour rehearsals will be held at the same location one evening each week of the 16-week course. Membership in the band will be by audition only and a maximum of 25 will be accepted.

INSTRUMENTATION includes trumpets, trombones, saxophones, piano, guitar, drums and bass. Tuition will be \$20.

The workshop will be under the direction of Richard Saunders, band and orchestra director at Livonia's Stevens High School. He will be assisted by Robert W. Jones, composer-in-residence at Schoolcraft.

Some handy information about new phone rates within Michigan.

They're simpler.

With the chart below, for instance, you can figure out what it will cost to call any number in the state. Any number outside of your local calling area.

Four things determine what you pay:

How far you call within Michigan.

How long you talk.

Whether an operator calls the number or you dial it yourself.

The time and day.

And the rates are more fair.

Look at the chart again. Notice that you're now charged for "each" minute you use the phone. (Before, you'd pay for no less than 3 minutes. Whether you used them all or not.)

Also notice that you're given discounts for dialing direct rather than using an operator.

Both of these changes were made for one reason. People should only be asked to pay for what they use.

Fair? Fair.

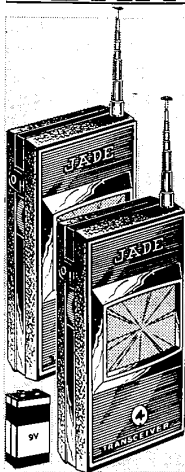

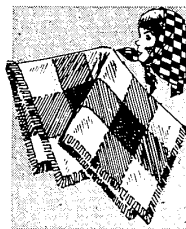

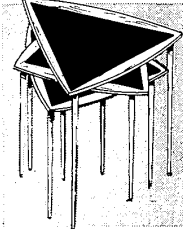
