ing, encourage them to choose it in a favorite style. Medium tones look best on most children; however, even black, when accented with bright colors, can enhance a young face.

9. PRAISE YOUR children when they make wise choices in matching outfits or selecting quality items. In younger children, develop confidence in making the right choices by playing a game with a store catalog. Cut out pictures of shirts, skirts, pants, etc., and play games putting different outfits together. Talk about colors and how to mix and match

patterns. This will help children prepare for those hurried school mornings when you may be too busy to supervise.

10. MAKE THE shopping trip a special treat by taking each child separately whenever possible. Shopping with each child alone is a high-quality time for the two of you. Two hours is the maximum amount of time you should spend to avoid frayed nerves on both sides.
