

Hawks to soar back to summit

On defense, where the Hawks excelled but were overshadowed by Coleman and the potent offense, Nichols is the heir apparent to all-star Chris Cox's role as the unit leader.

"THE DEFENSE will be fast and aggressive," Herrington said. "We're a little smaller on defense but we're quick."

Nichols and Schumacher will be the inside linebackers in Harrison's 52 alignment, and senior Jason Buchanan (5-6, 168) steps in at noseguard. Skinner and senior Joe Hammann (5-9, 173) are the tackles. Kate and junior Joe George (5-10, 175) the ends.

"By the end of last year, (Skinner) was probably our outstanding lineman," said Herrington of the captain and three-year varsity letterman.

Burgess, who had eight interceptions, is the

other holdover on defense at halfback, and Waudron becomes a two-way starter this year at free safety. Varsity veterans Rob MacDonald (5-9, 167) and Jason Lichtenman (5-10, 144) replaced graduated starters at strong safety and cornerback, respectively.

Hill will do the placekicking again and has increased his field-goal range. Herrington said He was 46-of-48 on extra points and booted two field goals, accounting for 52 points.

ACCORDING TO the football grapevine, trans-

fer players are supposed to help Harrison, but all three are juniors learning the system, Herrington said.

But Cres Gove (6-1, 209), who moved from Denver last winter, will see action at tackle. The others are running back Scott Legan (6-1, 180) from Texas and tight end Eric Junges (6-1, 210) from Dearborn, Mich.

"We have great potential and, if it's realized, should have a very good season," said Herrington, adding he'll worry about winning the Western Lakes championship (something the Hawks didn't do last year) before a return trip to the Dome.

"I'm real optimistic about this team," he added, citing "the players' dedication to the program in the off-season and the excellence in the skill positions."

"I think they will maintain the tradition."

"He more than held his own," Miltzler said. "He was real impressive, the way he handled everything. He reacts to things like an experienced player."

Dan Dressler, a 6-foot-1, 205-pound senior, is the only returning player with experience on the line and will start at tackle.

A host of rookies with JV backgrounds — including Jason Gutting (6-0, 250), center Bashir Hancock (5-6, 145), guard Sam Tanari (6-2, 175), tackle Dorek Mehraban (6-4, 220), tackle Eric Kraman (5-10, 280) and guard Ron Laramago (5-10, 175), a Livonia Stevenson transfer — and sophomore guard Steve Walter (6-0, 165) are the other line prospects.

"WE'RE DEFINITELY going to have to mix it up," said Miltzler of the run and the pass. "We don't have enough horses to dominate the line. If the offensive line comes around, we can do the kind of things we want to do. We've got a defense off balance," he added. "Hopefully, we

won't have to keep it too simple."

On defense, Culicke heads the linebacking corps and will roam the middle in Farmington's stunt, 4-3 defense that is patterned after the one MSU plays. Woytowich, a tri-captain along with Celienski and Wooster, is the strongside linebacker and Wincey the weakside patroller.

Joining Siskosky in the secondary will be cornerbacks Adams and Bernhardt and Wooster at free safety. Gutting, Tanari and Hancock are the tackle candidates and Jones, Mehraban and Caramigna the end prospects.

The Falcons open Saturday, Sept. 3, at home against West Bloomfield before facing powerhouses Farmington, North Farmington and Westland John Glenn the next three weekends.

"The first game is very important, obviously," Miltzler said. "We'd like to get in the win column and get some confidence before we take 'em in the muders row."
