• DOCENTS FOR GARDENS



Artist brings fresh viewpoint of flowers

Jacqueline Woolf presents a different, intimate kind of floral portrait in a group of paintings on display at Ariana Gallery of Birmingham. In the midst of soft yellows of watercolor are one or two well-defined flowers.

Woolf, a West Bloomfield resident who always paints directly from nature, said her paintings are meant to recreate the experience of walking through a beautiful garden and then focusing on one flower.

"It's like having a camera in and out of focus," she said. "When I'm painting I begin by painting the bouquet from a great distance and end up with it in my hand."

"The basis, of course, is Oriental art."

She described her work as "a new way of looking at flowers."

WOOLF, A gardener, said she has been doing flowers for as long as she has been painting — that totals some 25 years.

She has a degree in art education from Wayne State University. Woolf has taught in Detroit public schools and continued her study of art at the Center for Creative Studies, Cranbrook and Wayne State. She has been in many regional art shows and her works are in many metropolitan area corporate collections.

Ariana Gallery, 386 E. Maple, Birmingham, is open 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday-Saturday and until 9 p.m. Thursday. Woolf's paintings with the theme, "Essence of Summer," will be at the gallery through the month.
