

Pick Jan. 11 As Raider Day

Monday Jan. 11, has been declared as North Farmington High School Football Team Day in Farmington Township.

The declaration setting aside a special day of honor for the NFHS Raiders was made in a resolution passed by the Farmington Township board at its last meeting.

EACH MEMBER of the team and coaching staff will be presented the Farmington Township civic recognition medal on Jan. 11.

The motion to honor the Raiders was made by Trustee Earl Opperthaus and passed unanimously.

The team compiled a 9-0 record this year, was named Class A state champions and whose coach, Ron Holland,

was named "coach of the year."

The achievement is even more deserving of recognition, it was noted, because this year the Raiders had the lowest turnout of candidates for the football team in the school's ten-year history.

The resolution urges all Farmington residents to recognize the outstanding qualities of the team on Jan. 11.

On that day, the team will be invited to attend the township board meeting to receive the civic medals from the township. The presentations will be made beginning at 7:30 p.m. Jan. 11 in the township hall on 11 Mile just west of Orchard Lake Rd.

Their visit with the young people came to an end all too quickly and it was time for them to drive back to Lima and fly to Quito, Ecuador, where Conrad was giving medical papers as he had done in Chimbote and Trujillo.

While in Quito they had the earthquake of which we read in our papers with some deaths. The 13th of this month they were home again. Marian will tell us of this wonderful trip at the January Women's Assn. meeting.
