Breakins Cost Schools Plenty

FARMINGTON spends hundreds of hours looking for ways to restore student activity funds, money for counselors and for art and music, then have to see \$15,000 and more go down the drain for breaking," board president John Washburn said.

Uninsured losses costing nearly \$10,000 in the past few weeks and the prospect of greatly increased insurance rates haunt Farmington public schools.
Theft of the complete public address system from Beechview and William Grace elementary schools pushed this year's burglary losses in the schools to \$15,000, according to Business Manager William Prisk.
The reason the Beechview and Grace school losses were not covered was that the equipment was installed in the walls and was considered part of the building, Prisk said.
"We are taking immediate steps to add these (built-in) items throughout the district to schedules that will provide insurance coverage," he added.
Inventories of all equipment are being computerized for quick checkups in the event of future breakins.
