The youths were invited to the weekly event by R.M. Burns, president of Holley Carburetor Division, Colt Industries, Warren.

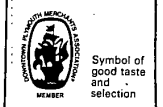

## Carso Heads Data Center



Martin P. Carso, Jr. has been named director of the traffic data center of the Traffic Improvement Association of Oakland County (TIA), according to an announcement by Edwin O. George of Detroit Edison and TIA president.

In this position, Carso will direct the operations of the computerized, countywide traffic data system which supplies traffic authorities with information used for engineering and enforcement improvements and public education activities.

The data system, which is nearing its third year of operation, has employed innovative techniques in identifying traffic accident factors

and has been cited by the National Highway Safety Bureau as an outstanding model program.

Carso recently completed a year of study at Michigan State University where he received a master's science degree from the school of Criminal Justice.

Prior to that, he served five years with the U.S. Air Force, where he served as a security police officer in England and France. He attained the rank of Captain.

He was awarded a bachelor of science degree in police administration in 1963, also at Michigan State University.

Carso resides with his family in Union Lake.

## 12 Killed In County

Twelve persons were killed in traffic accidents in Oakland County during the month of November according to the Traffic Improvement Association of Oakland County (TIA).

This compares to 23 persons killed during November of last year. The three year average of traffic fatalities for November amounts to 20.5 persons killed.

The November toll brings the total number of persons killed in 1970 this year to 181, considerably fewer than the 184 persons killed for the same period in 1969.

TIA reports that, according to a formula provided by the National A Safety Council, the direct costs of traffic

accidents reported thus far this year in Oakland County amounts to over \$3 million.

This is a conservative estimate, according to a TIA spokesman, who said that the addition of the indirect costs would probably double that figure.

### Bendix Elects New Director

## New Name Set By Camp Oakland

Members of Camp Oakland, Inc., have voted to expand the name of the nonprofit corporation to Camp Oakland Youth Programs, Inc.

"We are doing this to develop a better understanding of our activities," President Robert A. Dearth told members at the annual meeting at the Raleigh House in Southfield.

"People think of it as a summer camp for underprivileged children, but it's a lot more than that," Dearth said.

"In addition to summer camp, there are four other programs. Girls' Ranch and Boys' Ranch provide permanent homes for 38 children who would otherwise have no home; our work education program is giving pre-vocational training, counseling, and special schooling to high school dropouts, and our family camp program offers deprived, fatherless families a two-week camping vacation and counseling to help mothers cope with their children's problems."

DEARTH also announced a gift of \$5,000 from the Matilda Wilson estate, but said the funds will be used for a new vocational arts building, to be named for the late Mrs. Wilson. The building will supplement the C.B. DeVlieg Work Education Center.

A small vocational arts structure presently in use will be converted to a recreational hall, long needed for summer campers.

The camp's supporters re-elected Dearth, of Bloomfield Hills, to the office of president. Newly-elected to the post of vice president were Mrs. William B. Calhoun, Jr., of Bloomfield Hills, and Richard Guilford, of Birmingham.
