

Soroptimists Open Awards Competition

FARMINGTON

The Soroptimist Club of Farmington is inviting students from five area schools to participate in the Youth Citizenship Awards competition for 1971.

Invited to compete are students from Our Lady of Sorrows, Our Lady of Mercy, North Farmington, Far-

mington and Novi High Schools.

Three awards will be given by the Farmington Soroptimists — first place \$150, second \$100, third \$50.

The winner will compete in the regional award of \$1,000. The winner of each region will participate in the national competition which carries an award of \$1,500.

which will best further his aims and purposes in achieving his goal — education, travel, etc. The cash awards are paid in lump sums to the winning students.

Any student who will be graduating from public or private high school during the 1970-71 school year, but not later than June 1971 is eligible to apply.

TO QUALIFY for the awards which are to be judged on the merit and worth of the applicant, a student must have fulfilled these qualifications:

Service — applicant must have taken an active part in service, in the home, in the school and in the community, with a high degree of cooperation, courtesy and consideration for others.

Dependability — applicant must have executed responsibilities with truthfulness, loyalty and punctuality.

Leadership — applicant must have demonstrated ability to lead with self-control, dignity and responsibility.

Clear sense of purpose — applicant must have pursued

selected endeavors with sincerity and integrity.

There are no specific dates set within which the applicant has met the qualifications in school, home and community.

THE CANDIDATE must complete the official application and submit substantiating evidence in the form of three letters written by adult individuals not related to the candidate.

The local winner will be selected by a judging committee outside the membership of the Farmington Soroptimists. The winning

application will be forwarded to the regional chairman to compete for the \$1,000 award. The National Association of Secondary School Principals has placed the awards on its approved list of national contests and activities.

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Winners last year were Ken Grabowski of North Farmington High, Carol Bruce of Novi High and Nancy Smith of Farmington High.

THE SOROPTIMIST Foundations Youth Citizenship Awards are not scholarships, but are "Awards of Merit."

Each award may be used at the discretion of the recipient, in any way he may decide

Oppertthausen Withdraws Suit Appeal

The appeal against the summary judgment dismissal of a suit brought by Earl Oppertthausen, Farmington Township trustee, against Municipal Judge Michael Hand, Observer Newspapers, Inc., and others has been withdrawn.

Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Robert L. Temple dismissed the libel suit last July. Oppertthausen filed an appeal with the Michigan Court of Appeals, but the appeal was withdrawn in a court order dated Dec. 10.

The suit stemmed from allegedly libelous advertising placed in The Farmington Enterprise & Observer by supporters of Hand during his 1968 campaign for district judge against Oppertthausen.

Other defendants in the case were: Suzanne Shaughnessy, at that time editor of the Enterprise & Observer; Dr. John Richardson, Farmington City Councilman; Walter McCoy; Dennis Pheary; Patrick Nowak; and William Mitchell.

Lawyers explained that the decision to withdraw the appeal means the case is closed.
