**WANTED** Below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

**CHARGED**  
Two Detroit men face felony charges in connection with the theft of a bow and arrow and a radio from a storage locker at Hunters Ridge Apartments, 14 Mile and Orchard Lake Road, Nov. 17.  
They worked as maintenance workers at the complex.  
Arraigned Sunday before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, the two men, one 24, the other 22, stood mute to breaking and entering of an occupied dwelling with intent to commit larceny. Innocent pleas were entered.  
Cash/surety bond was set at \$5,000 pending a preliminary exam in 47th District Court.  
The theft occurred on Partridge Lane.  
Detective Charles Hubbard arrested the suspects Friday based on investigative leads. The property was recovered.

**WINDOW DAMAGE**  
No one was hurt when a ball bearing was fired into the front window of a car at the Lace Curtains Shop, 33216 Grand River, Saturday.  
Owner Elizabeth Jarvis and an employee were inside when they heard the window crack and sensed a pellet pass by at 6:15 p.m.  
A half-inch round hole was found in the plate-glass window. Damage was estimated at \$1,500, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.  
It was the sixth such incident reported in Farmington in the past two weeks.  
Similar window damage totaling \$650 was reported over the weekend at the office of dentist Robert K. Devine, 32423 Grand River, and to a vehicle parked at H.R. Krueger Machine Tool, 31506 Grand River.

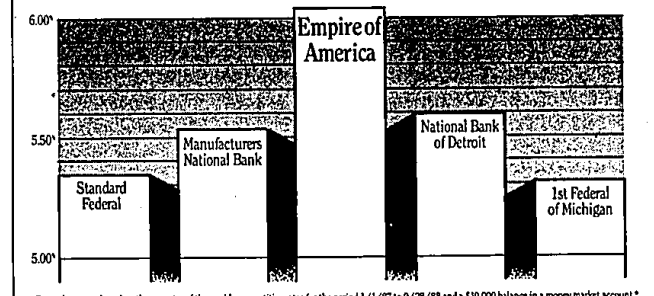
