

# It's Unbeaten Southfield, Bentley In Title Battle

Two unbeaten prep cage teams, each with six victories apiece, will clash head-on at 8:30 p.m. tonight (Saturday) in the Northwest Suburban Holiday tournament at Southfield High.

Southfield came from behind to whip previously unbeaten Walled Lake Central, 68-49, and Livonia Bentley romped 74-37, over Detroit's Redford High. Each winning team has a spotless record.

Redford will tangle with Walled Lake in the consolation game Saturday at 7 p.m. The Blue Jays started out like they were going to annihilate Walled Lake, jumping off to a 17-9 first-quarter bulge, but before the game ended, the score was tied

five times and the lead changed three times.

Again, the difference was big Brad Allen. He led all scorers with 20 points (15 in the second half) and grabbed 13 rebounds. Teammates Rick Moscow and Bob Green helped with 14 and 10 points respectively.

JIM STORY got 15 counters and 11 rebounds, and Luis Hysni and Randy McLean collected 10 points apiece for the losers.

The Jays ran up a 21-9 lead before Walled Lake became untraced. But Story got hot and tossed in 12 of his team's 14 points in the second stanza to make the halftime tally 29-23 in Southfield's favor.

Hysni heaved in four straight baskets at the start of the third frame to tie, 33-33, and moments later the Lakers went ahead, 41-39, their biggest lead of the game.

But with the score against them, 46-45, the Jays broke loose in the last quarter to show why they're one of the classiest teams in all of Oberverland.

Allen started the drive with a three-point play and he and his mates ran off eight straight points after that to take a lead they never gave up.

In all, the Jays outscored the Lakers 24-10 in the final frame.

Southfield hit 25 of 53 shots

and picked off 37 rebounds. BENTLEY showed who was boss right from the start in their lopsided victory.

They jumped to a 21-11 first-quarter lead, fashioned a 41-29 halftime ludge and plowed to a 60-38 third-quarter margin.

The game was tied, 5-5, in the opening moments, but the Livonia team proceeded to pump in 18 points in a row for a 21-5 lead and erase any doubts to who was the better team.

Bentley was outscored 19-14 in the last quarter but the team's reserves played most of that period.

The Bulldogs showed good balance as five players

scored in double figures. Louie Lovett got 18 points, Dave Vesich 14, Dan Weiss 13, and Dick Boehn and Tim Bollin 10 apiece. Bollin also snared 12 rebounds.

Tom Randall paced the Redford attack with 12 points.

Bentley hit 25 of 46 shots from the floor for 54 per cent and out-rebounded Redford, 33-23.

# Plymouth Wins In Tourney

The Plymouth basketball team gave their coach, Dick Beary, an early Christmas gift Wednesday in the opener of the six-team Wayne invitational tournament by trouncing the host squad, 66-43.

The Rocks' easy victory gave them the right to meet Westland John Glenn at 7 p.m. tonight (Saturday) in the semifinals. Glenn drew a first-round bye.

The victor in the Glenn-Plymouth contest will clash at 9 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 29, with the winner of the Belleville-Livonia Churchill game that takes place at 9 p.m. Saturday (tonight). Churchill also drew a first-round bye.

A consolation game for third and fourth place will also take place Tuesday, Dec. 29, but at 7 p.m.

BELLEVILLE earned the right to meet Churchill by shellingacking Cherry Hill, 76-63, Wednesday in the contest following the Plymouth-Wayne encounter.

Against Wayne, the Rocks led all the way in chalking up their second victory in five starts.

Strictly a team victory, the Rocks got balanced scoring as four players hit double figures.

Howie Schryer paced the Rocks' attack with 14 points. Dave Van Wagoner got 12, and Charlie Wolfe and Gary Cloke picked up 10 apiece.

Rich Fidh notched 12 markers and Merrill Collins 11 in leading the Wayne offense.

Plymouth out-rebounded Wayne better than 2-1. The hosts, in fact, led only at the charity line, hitting 11 of 17.

The Rocks sank six of 12 gift shots.

Plymouth jumped off to an 8-1 lead, with nearly four minutes going, by before Wayne pumped in its first basket.

AFTER THAT, however, the Zebras indicated for a few minutes they wanted to make a contest of it and edged up to within two points

of the Rocks early in the second period.

But once the score hit 16-14 still in favor of Plymouth, the Rocks turned on the heat and the outcome was never in doubt.

They built up a 30-23 halftime lead, a 52-35 third-quarter bulge and were on top, 61-39, with three minutes to go when both coaches sent their reserves into the game.


