Karen Suber of Farmington Hills is among the Alma College students selected to work with faculty members and administrators on Alma's community government committees for the 1988-89 academic year.

Suber, a junior, is one of six students on the Communications Committee, which concerns itself with the professional standards, financing, staffing and the responsibility of the broader campus community of the various on-campus communication organs such as student newspaper, yearbook and radio station.

Students apply and are selected for committee service by a Community Government Selection Committee

composed of four Alma students. The Student Congress then approves the committee assignments.

Students serve on seven community government committees: Educational Policy, Academic Standards, Curricular Affairs, Student Life, Communications, Judicial, and President's Advisory Council. The only one which has no student representation is the committee which is responsible for Alma's teacher education program.
