Farmington-area parents who have children with handicaps of all types can attend a free workshop on "Activating Parents in the Special Education Process" this month.

Sponsored by the Oakland County Society for Deaf Citizens and the Citizens Alliance to Uphold Special Education, or CAUSE, the seminar is scheduled for Saturday, Jan. 21, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Eastover Elementary School, 1101 Westview, Bloomfield Hills.

The workshop is designed to help parents participate in the planning, development and decision-making for their child's education.

TOPICS TO be covered include: understanding the law, your rights and special education rules, preparing for and participating in the Individualized Education Program Conference for your child, obtaining information about services, resources and programs available, becoming an educational advocate for your child.

Group aids women in need of job

The Jewish Vocational Service Displaced Homemaker Program provides a variety of services for women who need help entering the job market after years in the home.

JVS counselors can help displaced homemakers with assessing their interests, values and abilities, planning careers, developing job-seeking skills and finding employment opportunities.

Displaced homemakers are women who have lost their source of economic support because of divorce, separation, widowhood or disability of a spouse. After spending a number of years in the home caring for family members, displaced homemakers may find returning to the job market a difficult transition.

Displaced homemakers who need a boost toward entering the job market are invited to contact Sherri Lumberg at JVS, 559-5000. Eligibility is based on marital and employment status. There are no income guidelines.

Hills-based bank buys ailing S&L

Farmington Hills-based Michigan National Corp. acquired Beverly Hills Federal Savings Bank, a savings and loan association based in Beverly Hills, Calif.

Beverly Hills Federal Savings Bank has assets of \$1.7 billion and operates six offices serving southern California markets.

The Beverly Hills transaction is Michigan National's first acquisition in California. The thrift was acquired through a bidding process conducted by the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corp.

The terms of the transaction include an equity capital infusion of \$52 million by Michigan National Corp. into Beverly Hills Federal Savings Bank.

In making the announcement, Robert Mylod, chairman and chief executive officer of Michigan National Corp., said, "The acquisition of this potentially outstanding financial services organization is consistent with our policy of only making acquisitions that enhance our shareholders' value."

"This transaction has been structured to clearly achieve such a result. By expanding into the attractive Beverly Hills area, we believe there is potential for significant earnings growth in the years ahead."
