Deborah Hulbert, whose daughter.

Deborah Hulbert, was shot to death in December 1986, is seeking \$10 million from the assallants, their families and a friend of the victim. Steven Stamper of Yepsilant Township also was convicted of killing Hulbert. The victim's father, Joseph Hulbert, lives in Farmington Hills.

Holbert is asking for \$1 million in punitive damages from those in-

volved in the murder, and an additional \$\frac{1}{2}\$ million from Machacek and Stamper for statutory rape.

At the time of Mary Anne Helbert's death, the girl believed she was pregnant by Machacek. After their arrest, Machacek and Stamper said they wanted to scare the girl into having a miscarriage by firing rifles near her. The defendants, who were 16 at the time of the murder, biamed each other for firing the fatal shots.

Machacek has an excellent chance of winning on appeal, Digon said. Ac-cording to Digon, bearsay was ad-mitted into evidence; sheriffs erred in their investigation; and pretrial publicity via the felevision show, "A Current Affair," and Young Miss magazine jeopardized the defend-ants' right to a fair trial.
