Rabies and unsexed animal certificates, signed by an accredited veterinarian must be presented when applying for a license. The certificate must show vaccine as being effective through the date of application. A copy of a receipt from the veterinarian is NOT acceptable.

The City of Farmington Hills Winter, 1988, tax statements are payable December 1, 1988, through February 14, 1989. A 4% penalty will be added on February 15, 1989.

Beginning March 1, 1989, all taxes must be paid to C. Hugh Dohany, Oakland County's Treasurer, with a 4% collection fee plus Oakland County's interest rate.

City Hall Offices will be open for payment of taxes 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

For taxpayers convenience, a depository located on the East wall of the Front Courtyard is available for tax payments. Payments may also be made at the following banks during regular business hours:
NATIONAL BANK OF DETROIT (15 fee will be charged for each payment)
MICHIGAN NATIONAL BANK (no fee)
MANUFACTURERS BANK (no fee)

The above banks will accept tax payments until the close of business on February 14, 1989. Whether taxes are paid in person, through the mail, or by depository, be sure to return the TOP HALF OF YOUR TAX BILL. PLEASE DO NOT SEND THE BOTTOM HALF, as our computer service can only process the top portion of the bill.

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Tupper at 8:00 p.m. on February 6, 1989, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

Minutes of the previous meeting of January 16, 1989, were approved as written.

Council held a Public Hearing on the Special Assessment Roll for the 1988 Sidewalk Program, and adopted a resolution confirming the special assessment roll with one exception.
